Sensenbrenner Hall • Milwaukee, Wisconsin



Sensenbrenner Hall is home to the Klingler College of Arts and Sciences, the Department of History and the Honors Program. Built in 1924, the building is named for benefactor Frank J. Sensenbrenner, a Kimberly-Clark executive.

Originally built in 1924, the building received several updates in the 1960s, which are were not as well-built as the original structure. Those updates done in the 1960's were demolished as part of an overall plan to strategically add a modest addition to serve the program of the College of Arts & Sciences and set up the structure for future expansion as part of the campus master plan.

The building renovation included the refurbishing of the reading room, main staircase, skylights, and mezzanine library space tastefully designed by Korb and Associates. The addition includes and open atrium space connecting the old and new building. Mechanical and electrical systems were completely redone and connected to the campus infrastructure.
