Please arrive at 8:30 a.m. on the day of the Camp Session.

WHAT TO WEAR:

- Your child should dress for the weather.
- Students must wear a fully enclosed shoe such as a tennis shoe or boots.
- Light, loose fitting clothing is preferred. Students will get dirty so please keep that in mind when choosing clothing. This is an interactive camp and will include arts and crafts so if you want to send an old oversized t shirt to minimize wear and tear on clothing you may.
- In case of threat of inclement weather, parents will be contacted prior to the start of the camp and we will reschedule if needed. If your child cannot attend on the rescheduled date, you will be entitled to a full refund.

WHAT TO BRING:

- Bottled Water
- 1 Mid-day snack
- 1 Lunch in a Labeled Container, a refrigerator is available if needed.
- Sunscreen
- Towel

Electronic devices will not be permitted. We will share a camp counselor's cell number in case of an emergency.

Students will ride on motorized vehicles with supervision. Students will also interact with horses under supervision according to their age and comfort level. Our camp is not designed for riding.

Students will encounter our resident farm dog and cat as well as donkeys, horses, ponies and miniature horses. Please let us know of allergies to animal hair and dander as well as allergies to hay.

Students that sign up for all 4 modules will receive a t-shirt they will wear on the last day of camp. Parents/guardians will be invited to join the students at 1:00 pm for students to share what they learned during our camp. You will receive an invitation prior to the camp so you can plan on attending if convenient.

Please note, the person picking the student up must have a photo I.D.

PICK UP IS PROMPTLY AT 2:00 pm. Please call immediately if pick-up will be delayed as the Rescue gate will be locked at 2:15 p.m.
