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## **Clinical Scope of Practice**

Four Clinical Roles & Operational Leadership

## **1. Emergency Care Responder (FROS / FREC 3 & 4)**

- Scene assessment and dynamic risk assessment.
- Basic Life Support (Adult & Paediatric) including AED use.
- Airway adjuncts (OPA/NPA) and oxygen therapy.
- Catastrophic haemorrhage control.
- Basic trauma and medical emergency management.
- Vital signs monitoring including blood glucose.
- Medications: Oxygen, Adrenaline (auto-injector), Aspirin, Salbutamol, Oral Glucose, Paracetamol (authorised use).
- Escalation, documentation, and safety netting advice.

## **2. Emergency Care Technician**

- All Emergency Care Responder competencies.
- Advanced patient assessment and ECG monitoring (including 12-lead acquisition).
- Supraglottic airway management and manual defibrillation.
- IV cannulation (authorised practice).
- Medications: Entonox, IM Adrenaline, Salbutamol, Ipratropium, Aspirin, Paracetamol, Ibuprofen, Oral Morphine (authorised), Antiemetics.
- Safe transport and monitoring.
- Discharge of low-risk patients under approved pathways.
- Written and verbal safety netting advice and referral pathways.

### **3. NMC Registered Emergency Care Nurse**

- Autonomous assessment and clinical decision-making.
- Peripheral cannulation and IV therapy.
- Advanced wound care and suturing (trained personnel).
- Medications under PGD/prescribing authority: IV analgesia, antibiotics, antiemetics, bronchodilators, steroids, IV fluids.
- Independent discharge authority for appropriate presentations.
- Comprehensive discharge planning and documented safety netting.
- Safeguarding leadership and mentoring responsibilities.

### **4. HCPC Registered Paramedic**

- Autonomous assessment, diagnosis, and treatment planning.
- Advanced airway management and IV/IO access.
- Advanced pharmacology: Adrenaline, Amiodarone, Morphine, Fentanyl (authorised), Midazolam, Tranexamic Acid, IV Fluids, Bronchodilators, Aspirin, Antiemetics.
- Advanced Life Support leadership and trauma interventions.
- Independent discharge at scene with shared decision-making.
- Robust safety netting and referral into urgent/emergency pathways.
- Clinical leadership and mentorship.

### **Operational Team Leader**

- Oversight of staff welfare and wellbeing.
- Clinical mentoring and professional development support.
- Governance oversight including incident review and reflective practice.
- Operational leadership and liaison with partner agencies.
