Mississippi Highway Patrol Reaching Out to Save Our Teens' Lives

Major Johnny Poulos, is no stranger to the Biloxi Lions Club, having spoke to us on many occasions regarding how to make our lives safer while driving when he was serving with the MHP Troop K serving Harrison County. This time, as the Director of Public Affairs, Maj. Poulos, shared a very important teenage driving program that MHP is currently providing: **PROM (Leave Return On Monday).**

Today with more faster vehicles on the road accidents are bound to happen. The main cause of many of the teen accidents is driver distraction. The root cause of driver distraction is the cell phone. Compound that fact with the lack of seat belt use and the fender bender can become a fatality accident. But, the fatality statistics are indicating its not just one lone teenager, but it multiples of our kids in the same vehicle that are dying.

In 2019 there were 48 teenage driving fatalities. In 2020 that statistic rose to over 70. Which, by the way, ranks Mississippi #2 in the nation for teenage driving fatalities per 100,000 capita. It would not be unreasonable to believe the statistic could go over 100 in 2021 if awareness was not brought to the Mississippi public on a wider scale.

The MHP Public Affairs Division routinely conducts presentations of teen driving education in our schools. However, since March 2020 the COVID19 crisis made it difficult for them to visit schools. Is the reason the number of teen fatality driving is increasing? They think it may. On **Tuesday, March 30th at 6:30pm**, the MHP live is streaming

On **Tuesday, March 30th at 6:30pm**, the MHP live is streaming **PROM (Leave Return On Monday)** on their Mississippi Highway Patrol's Facebook page. While it is targeted for teenage drivers, they want reach everyone: parents, family members, friends, etc., to see the reality of teenage driving fatalities. They say a picture is worth a 1000 words, Major Poulos stated that this graphic video hits home with both sight and sound.
