Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker was Harrison County Sheriff Troy Peterson. He was raised in Gulfport and graduated from Harrison Central High School in 1988 and went on to earn an Associate of Arts Degree with honors in Criminal Justice from Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College. He enlisted in the Army in 1989. After being honorably discharged in 1994, he began his career in law enforcement as a Corrections Officer with the Harrison County Sheriff's Department. He went on to serv as a County Patrolman, a Narcotics Investigator, a SWAT Team member, a Task Force Agent with the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, an agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration, Captain over the Harrison County Narcotics Division, and Director over the Coastal Narcotics Enforcement Team. In 2015 he retired as Captain over both task forces to run for Sheriff of Harrison County of which he was elected and took office in 2016.
