

Andrew (Andy) Taggart 2019 Candidate for MS Attorney General

Mr. Taggart, a native of Moss Point, is the first of the four candidates seeking the office of Mississippi Attorney General to speak to the membership of the Biloxi Lions Club on why he wants to hold this office.

According to Andy, as he wishes to be called, said that he and his wife, Karen, felt the timing was right in their lives for him to take on the duties of Mississippi's Attorney General. This decision was made in part of the 2012 tragic death of their son from drug addiction. "There's predators and victims in the drug war, the system has to treat predators and victims differently" stated Andy. His platform is 3 fold:

- The AG is the State's Chief Law Enforcement Officer—more need of public policy of litigation, not legislation. The AG office is responsible for training prosecutors across the state and he would use that role to shape drug policy statewide.
- 2) The AG is the Top Lawyer in the State—our AG needs more than just a law degree, the AG must have courtroom practice and experience. Andy explained his vast experience since he started his law practice
- 3) Every elected official must has a vision for the future for our State of Mississippi– the status quo is not good enough any more. With 5 of the 8 top elected positions in the state of Mississippi up for grabs Mississippi will have new leadership and Andy is in hopes that he can bring his experience to be elected as the next Attorney General.
