Closures/Cancellations Known At This Time

While many of the LCI and Lions of MS functions were cancelled or postponed by the COVID19 mandates since mid-March I am only going to mention two items of immediate interest.

The Mid-South Lions **Give the Gift Dinner/Auction** held in Memphis at the Hamilton Eye Institute was cancelled in April and rescheduled for August 21-22. However, with the HEI building not scheduled re-opened by that date the decision was made to cancel the Give the Gift Dinner and Live Auction and hold just the online auction portion of the event. CAMP WILKES UPDATE

Lion Penny, Acting Camp Property Manager, presented a brief update on the past year at Camp Wilkes as the over 6700 people utilized the facility.

Penny thanked the camp caretaker, Bobby Darty, for all he has done to keep the 89 acre facility looking the best it has looked in years. She invited members who have not been to Camp in a long time to come visit and see our Lions Cabin, which was dedicated in 1966. Three items of interest Penny mentioned were:

1) Bobby is finishing up on the 2 month pool project with mucking out and pressure washing the 164,000 gallon pool, repainting the pool, renumbering depth indicators, and filling the pool.

3) One of the newest additions to camp are the 73 new dorm style mattresses (32 in Lions Cabin, 32 in AJ Cabin, and 9 in JD Trail.) The new 8" mattresses replaced aging 6" cotton mattresses. The mattresses were purchased through a \$9808 grant obtain from the Coast Electric Community Foundation to purchase the mattresses.

4) A volunteer group from the University of NC at Chapel Hill in early March cleaned up and remarked the 77 acres of trails.
