Have you ever heard there is of a shortage of blood in your area? Was there a major disaster with multiple injuries, or just a rare type is needed for one person, and you thought of donating? But it would be your first time donating and you are putting it off because you are a bit appre-hensive, even a bit scared. Or, have you thought that considering we are in the middle of a very infectious global pandemic called COVID19 is it even safe to donate at this time?

The Need of Donating Blood Still Exist, Even in a Pandemic

Whether your blood is the universal '0' Positive, or a rarer blood type, blood is

always in demand, pandemic or not. Our speaker, Denise Smith, American Red Cross Account Manager Blood Services for Alabama and Mississippi Region, shared why it is even more important to donate blood during our COVUD crisis.

Denise started off with a short video of 4 donors explaining their concerns of donating for the first time. To help with their apprehension, each donor had an assistant to stay one-on-one with them. What was so special about this? Each assistant was a child who shared stories and laughter to take the donor's mind off the donation process.

At the completion of the process it was revealed by each assistant their Continued on page 3







personal reason why blood donation was important to them, which ranged from the rare genetic blood disorder of sickle cell anemia to leukemia. As most often with these type diseases, the children each needed numerous blood transfusions just to stay alive. Denise had warned that the video was moving and that it was. Denise followed the video by sharing that every two seconds a patient will need blood making the reality of blood donation a life or death situation. Many people donate blood on a regular basis. How-ever, many more often many wait just for blood drives, or just when the need is critical. Denise add-ed that statistics indicate 99% of 1st time donors will lead to loyal donors. She even has a 92 year old currently still active in donating. "Donating 1 pint of blood can help save 3 lives" Denise explained. COVID19 and donations: the need for blood does not stop for a pandemic. Persons donating are verified to be either COVID negative, or if you have had COVID, you are screened for antibodies. If you have fully recovered from the virus you can donate Convalescent plasma, the liquid part of the

you have fully recovered from the virus you can donate Convalescent plasma, the liquid part of the blood that is collected and shared with the most serious COVID patients, use to boost their immune systems fight off the infection.

Denise shared she was surprised that 1000 units of blood was collected at the local July 30th blood drive. She said she tracts the blood donations to see where the blood, or plasma, is sent to save a life. In closing she reiterated that blood does not stop for pandemics and asked if the Biloxi Club members knew of anyone or a group who wishes to sponsor a drive. She ended her program with an active question and answer session.
