8. Program: Lion Jerry introduced today's speaker Elizabeth Anderson, Outreach Coordinator for the Maritime and Seafood Museum

The Story of the Nydia and the Maritime & Seafood Industry Museum

Elizabeth Anderson, Outreach Coordinator of the Maritime & Seafood Industry Museum presented a true Biloxi History lesson by bringing to life the story of a 30-foot gaff-rigged cabin sloop that was built in Biloxi in 1898. The cypress and steam-bent oak sloop was built by William N. Johnson, Johnson Shipbuilding, on Biloxi's back bay for John A. Rawlins, Commodore of the New Orleans Southern Yacht Club. The racing sloop was named Nydia.

The Nydia won it's first race, the Bay-Waveland Yacht Club Regatta in 1899. She was a very fast perfectly balance sloop and went on to race more than 39 times from 1900-1910 earning her owner a showcase of trophies and awards.

Her next owner was A. Baldwin Wood, a Tulane University graduate and engineer by profession known for his invention of the wood screw design for the drainage pump system in NOLA, was an avid sailor. While his main residence in NOLA he kept a home in Biloxi just for his prize racing sloop Nydia. Every weekend in the summer he would sail to his favorite place, Horn Island. In the winter, Nydia was stored on the front lawn of his Biloxi home under a powerful spotlight to show off her beauty. Come spring the massive undertaking of moving her on a specially built carriage was a great spectacle for Wood's neighbors as she cross the beach road and sand to the water.

In 1956 at age 77 while sailing, Wood past and waved to his friend, Capt. Louis Gorenflo, operator of the charter boat Sailfish. Shortly afterwards Gorenflo notice that Wood was kneeling and slumped over the tiller of the sloop. Seeing the Nadia was headed for a large pier, Gorenflo caught up to the sloop to put a man aboard who was able to steer her safely away from the pier. Baldwin Wood died doing what he loved to do...go sailing on his beloved Nydia.

But the story does not end here...in his will Wood left his estate to his Alma Mater, Tulane, so that his Nydia would be cared for and preserved for 99 years. Tulane displayed the Nydia at their Uptown Campus until 2004, then she was moved to storage to make room for campus improvements.

Wood's nephew, Ralph Wood Pringle, and the Friends of the Nydia, did not think that Tulane was living up to it's end of the bargain of preservation and sought to gain custody of the sloop. Custody was awarded to Pringle and he brought the Nydia back home to the Mississippi Gulf Coast for much needed preservation work.

Following Hurricane Katrina's destruction of the Seafood Museum housed in the old Coast Guard building at Biloxi's Point Cadet, the new Maritime and Seafood Industry Museum plans were designed to accommodate and prominently feature the Nydia. The Grand Hall on the second floor would become her new home as she was carefully hoisted up the side of the building by cranes and moved in before the full glass window panels were installed. She is the last surviving Johnson built boat... a true Biloxi nautical treasure.


