Coastal Transit Authority (CTA) We Keep the Gulf Coast Rolling for You!

Kevin Coggin, ED for the CTA, who has visited the Biloxi Lions for many years, shared recent happenings along the Coast that the CTA has had a pleasure of being a part of in *Keeping the Gulf Coast Rolling for You*. As the ED since 2003 Coggin described his job as a Lobbyist in 3 categories: Plan, Finance, and Political. CTA is a Government Agency, Public Utility Nonprofit with 105 employees.

CTA strives to achieve Alternative Fuels with their buses being directed to carbon reducing footprint vehicles of propane, hybrids, and 1 total electric bus.

He expounded on how our Lion Jerry Dodge has been valuable member of the CTA Board for many years and that he was on hand at the Tram-Pedestrian Bridge Ribbon cutting in Gulfport on Feb, 23, 2024. "The Tram-Pedestrian Bridge was a \$2.6M grant received in 2018 on which 80% Federal Grant with 20% from local funding. Awarded in 2018 the tram bridge project was designed to provide a safe transit pathway for bike and pedestrian traffic (estimated over 200,00 people during the many Jones Park events throughout the year) from the north side of Hwy 90, near the MS Aquarium and the CTA Bus Hub station, going south over Hwy 90 to Jones Park. "The Old Gulfport Library was renovated for the CTA Hub with 100% Federal funded \$10M grant further explained Coggin.

CTA provides service to 7 cities in the 3 coastal countries of Hancock, Harrison, and Jackson. A short list of their services available is fixed routes, demand response, senior citizen rates, special services for disabled persons, mental health service, as well as, assist with employment transportation to and from south Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama.

À new CTA grant for \$24M is the 80% RAISE grant to build a internodal transportation center at Memorial Hospital. From this new Hub CTA plans to extend bus service to Long Beach, Pass Christian, and Bay St. Louis. Because of the high vehicle traffic on 15th Street and the estimated 8900 pedestrian traffic the new Hub will also have a 4 story parking garage that will provide a 3rd floor pedestrian walkway into the Hospital.

Coggin opened the floor for Q and A. Members provided numerous questions and Coggin provided very informative responses to each. 2 questions were:

- 1) Q: with DL or IDs needed for job interviews why aren't the CTA stops closer to MDPS offices? A: they were on routes when the agency offices were in downtown, but economics when the agencies grow they move out of towns to get cheaper land for more room
- 2) Q: the Coast East-West Corridor project update, is CTA involved? A: CTA is involved with the design and engineering of the 5 segments. The 1st segment is the Irish Hill to Veterans and Veterans to Popps Ferry. 30% of the design/engineering is completed with the environment study in the next 12 months.
