- 1. President Jerry G:
- a) August 10th Board Mtg, 13th at Cadence Bank on Howard Ave., 2nd floor, noon, bring your own lunch
- 2. PP Melinda welcomed Lion Kathryn back after her recuperation from surgery. She presented Lion Kathryn with a Certificate of Appreciation for serving the Biloxi Lions so well during Lion Melinda's term as President. PP Melinda also welcomed new member Lion Susan Baumgartner, via zoom, to the club. Lion Susan and her husband transferred to the Biloxi from the Woolmarket Club.
- 3. Lion Margot gave the Vision Screening Committee report on the Edgewater Rotary Children's Health Fair held on June 22. During the 4 hour event the Biloxi Lions screened 75 children with 42 passing, 26 being referred to see an optometrist, and 7 screened inconclusive. Club volunteers were Lions Brandy Champlin, Tadd Gabrielson, Rev. Elijah Mitchell, Miriam Mitchell, Juanita Horton, Dorothy Nehlig, Glenn Quave, and Margot Swetman.
- 3. District 30S LCIF Coordinator Lion Carl gave a report on his attendance to the LCIF training in Chicago. PIP Brian Sheehan, LCIF Chairman, is asking that every member donate at least \$1 so that the Club can be a 100% Club. Lion Carl also reported on the Moss Point tornado disaster relief project. Approx. \$1K has been used of the \$10K grant funding. This has been for ice chests, cooling towels and 2x4s. The ice and water has been donated thus far. There are still 500 families displaced. The Woolmarket Club's cleaning and care kits are still being distributed as needed. In closing he said that he and Lion Dorothy are driving to Reno for the USA/Canada Leadership Forum and have room in their vehicle should anyone wish to attend the forum on Sept. 21-23.

Michelle Anderson, ED, Infinity Science Center

As many of us residing on the MS Gulf Coast know, we are truly blessed with the large facility located in Hancock County known as the NASA Stennis Space Center. As a recent BLC's noon program reminded us, the space center tested the Saturn V rockets for the Apollo moon mission and is now testing rockets for the Moon and Beyond mission to Mars.

From the space center coastal involvement came an idea to start a museum at Stennis. This small museum was relocated on land donated by NASA on Interstate 10, expanded to 70,000 sq, ft, and is now known as the Infinity Science Center. Today's speaker, Michelle Anderson, was appointed as the Executive Director in August 2020. Assisting Michelle today was her husband. Gus.

Assuming her duty during the world-wide pandemic of COVID19 Michelle said that going from a staff of 20 to a staff of 4, and losing thousands of dollars of revenue because of not being able to open as many days due to the COVID restrictions, the Center is just now starting to bounce back to pre-COVID days.

The mission to Inspire, Amaze, Engage, Create, and Cultivate is still strong with all of the original programs offered such as the for-all-ages interactive exhibits and the video features, as well as the Infinity's Hero Astronaut Fred Haise Exhibit. Of course, Fred Haise, a native of Biloxi, served aboard the Apollo 13 Mission to the moon. Watch the Ron Howard movie, Apollo 13th if you are not familiar with this mission. Fred serves on the Infinity Board and is very instrumental ISC Ambassador.

Getting aback to Infinity's other offerings....Field Trips: the 2019 pre-COVID trip trips numbers were 720. The numbers are climbing back and the Center feels the scheduled field trips will far exceed those in 2019; Virtual Field Trips: about the only way to experience the Infinity Center during COVID, the virtual field trips are a success and are still continued; Multiple Level Labs; Homeschool Events; Homeschool Supplemental Material; Scout Programs/Events; Birthday Parties; Camps; Virtual Camps; and Professional Developments/CEUs.

Lions of MS Sight Foundation Needs Your Help in 2023-2024

If you have...Great and thank you!...you will agree that the program is vital its purpose, to the community children it serves, to you, and to your club in sponsoring or volunteering. Ever wonder where the majority of the above programs funding comes from?

The Sight Foundation is the fundraising arm of the Lions of MS. The Foundation needs support through contributions to assure the continuation of the vital work started.

Each year a budget goal is set by the Sight Foundation based on a budget each of the above committees send to the Foundation. If the fiscal year ending budget goal is met, or surpassed, the Sight Foundation then disburses funding for the requesting program. However, should the fiscal year ending goal not be met then the requested funding is incrementally reduced by the total of percentage raised by the Foundation. Example: contributions received by clubs and individual members was only 78% of the goal, therefore, the funding to be received by the programs was reduced by 23%. Which is actually what happened this year.

Those of you who do volunteer your time and talent to make the above programs successful will realize how much money it takes to put on a 3 day camp, conference, or send the band internationally. Now visualize cutting even the smallest amount of funding...now imagine how hard may it be to bring an particular activity to that camp the additional funding was meant to cover in that year's budget? Yeah...


And we, Lions, are very fortunate to have the only Eye Bank in the State of MS. It takes funds to keep the doors open, lights on, and staffed for this vital part of our program and for those who may need corneas.

Were do the Foundation funds come from? Mainly through club fundraising and individual member contributions. That's right...you, the member. By your support of your Club's fundraising activities and contributing personally to Avery McKinley and White Cane fundraising activities. Please continue your support of the White Cane/Avery McKinley projects.

The Sight Foundation started an endowment campaign 2 years ago with the 15 Guns in 15 Day. It was very successful in its first 2 years selling raffle tickets for 15 sponsored pistols, hunting rifles, and shotguns. This year it was changed to 20 Guns in 20 Days. Again, Raffle Tickets are being sold. The Sight Foundation is asking for Clubs to support this vital fundraising activity.

The 2023 Raffle flyer is on page 5 for your convenience to print. Tickets are the same: 1 for \$20 or a book of 6 for \$100. Drawing will start on November 1 and continue for 20 days.
