Where There Is a Need There Is a Lion

Lions of MS District 30S step in to fill a need of Disaster Relief following the 6/19/2023 tornado that devastated 6 square miles of Moss Point, MS.

Starting the last week of June District 30S LCIF District Coordinator Carl Nehlig contacted the Moss Point Tornado Disaster Center and learned that volunteers are in short supply to distribute water and ice. So Lion Carl and Dorothy started driving the streets of the hardest hit area distributing ice and water for those either trying to repair their homes, or business, and to those that are trying to live in their homes, and all are without power during the sweltering heat. A LCIF Disaster Relief Grant has been approved and the funding will go to purchase ice chests, cooling neck cloths, and water.

On July 5th 2nd VDĞ Penny Edwards and Biloxi Club President Jerry Gardner joined to help in the distribution of the much needed ice and water. Lion Penny was told by a county spokesperson approximately 60 homes/buildings were total destroyed and approximately 360 structures (mostly homes) received major damage. Assessments are still ongoing to determine if repairs can be made or if the structure is beyond repair.

As soon as Lions Carl and Dorothy return from the LCICon in Boston they will resume working with the Woolmarket Club with their assistance of providing Cleaning Kits and Personal Care Items, which will be distributed along with the ice chests, water and cooling clothes.

Volunteers are needed to help with future distribution, particularly now that the grant funding has been made available. "We've only been able to go to Moss Point several days a week over the last 2 weeks, but the Lions' presence is noticed and much appreciated" states 2ndVDG Penny. "The residents in the areas with the most damage are mostly elderly living on fixed incomes in older homes. They are trying to stay in their very hot humid damaged homes with little or no means to stay cool or hydrated. Getting to the nearest cooling station or to a church providing meals is not an option for many. However, getting ice and clean drinking water means so much."

Please volunteer if you can by contacting Lion Carl or Lion Jerry. They are putting together a schedule and it soon be available soon.

BACK BAY MISSION

The Biloxi Club speaker for this week was Rev. James Pennington, Executive Director of Back Bay Mission and Ms. Samantha "Sam" Bell, Associate for the Mission's Housing Recovery Program.

Soon after joining Back Bay Mission in 2021 Rev. James spoke to the Club about the programs the Mission offered. At this visit he went into a bit more of his personal background, education, and training. Very interesting was the year and a half spent he in the capitol city of Siberia, Novosibirsk. He told of his work with the HIV patients, and particularly in orphanages where many of the children were HIV positive having had 1 or both parents dying from HIV.

Rev. James updated us on the Mission's programs of helping the needy with food; prescription Medications; getting clean clothing and showers; with mail, telephone, internet access; or with home repairs.

And with home repairs, he introduced Samantha Bell, the Mission's Housing Recovery Program Associate. Sam shared the personal connection she had with this program when she started trying to find help for her Mother's home thinking it needed just some minor repair. Sam's mom contacted Back Bay Mission and was put on a long waiting list. The long story short was that when her Mom's name came up for the repair, the home was found to need much more repair than Sam thought. There were unseen mold issues. Once the repair was completed and her Mother moved back home, Sam realized the years of the home's disrepair had a huge effect in her Mom's mental and physical wellbeing. It wasn't long after she return to her home that her Mom was happier and healthier than she had been in a long time. She is still living in her repaired home.

A few years later Sam learned someone else was on the "long list" and she called the Mission to advocate for the person. Sam was told that they were short staffed in the Housing Recovery Program. Sam, who was working for a law firm, said she had first hand experience when she helped her Mom get her home repaired. Sam started working for the Mission and the Housing Recovery Program and loves helping people. She said the "long list" is at 85 homes waiting for repairs. The Mission can only do so many homes at a time and list of those seeking assistance is increasing.


