Mississippi Sound Coalition

Whether if you are a native from the Mississippi Gulf Coast, a military transplant, a tourist, business owner, or just passing through today's speaker was speaking to us all. Former Biloxi Mayor Gerald Blessey is passionate about the town he was born and raised in...Biloxi, and that includes Biloxi's best known resource...the Mississippi Sound waters.


He started his talk about how as a child he remembers fishing to harvest the abundance of the different varieties of seafood found along in the coastal waters. As the years have passed the abundance and varieties have dwindled for numerous reasons. His talk today was on the *Death and Life of the Mississippi Sound* and what in very recent years has cause the decline of the Sound's best know resource, the seafood industry and its important to the local economy.

This is where the Mississippi Sound Coalition, formed in 2019, comes into important focus. A bit of geography and history comes into play...as any 5th grader learned the 2nd longest river in the United States is the mighty Mississippi River. It flows through or borders 10 states starting in Minnesota and empties into the Gulf of Mexico in South Louisiana. Over the thousands of miles the river's watershed empties over 1.6M gallons every second under normal, not flood stage, conditions. With this water movement south, including the tributaries comprising approximately 41% of the watershed drainage in the US, everything from natural debris, animal waste, fertilizer runoff from fields, down to city pollution flows into the Gulf of Mexico. However, all bets would be off when it comes to trying to control the volume of water during flood stage events to prevent flooding in major cities except for the numerous dams and levee control systems which placed all along the Mississippi River.

The Mississippi Sound Coalition was formed due to a historic wet season event that happened in 2019. The Mississippi was in an usually high flood stage mode with dams all along the river being opened to allow more water to flow south to prevent major flood in the upper 10 states. As the water levels started to rise in the lower part of the 10 states, Louisiana in particularly, the spillways as they are called were opened to allow more water to flow faster south to the Gulf. This is a normal process to divert flood waters, however, in February 2019 the process became a huge problem for the Mississippi Sound when a decision was made by the Army Corps of Engineers to open the Bonnet Carre Spillway and leave it open for an unprecedented 118 days. The Bonnet Carre Spillway is 12 west of the City of New Orleans and is designed to control flood waters from overwhelming New Orleans. Being opened is not usually but opened for 118 days allowed too much fresh water too fast into the Mississippi Sound. A harmful algae bloom (HAB) from the fertilizer contained in run off water exploded to uncontrollable levels from Louisiana east to Alabama. Waters of south Mississippi took the brunt of the damage caused by the extremely high HAB. Marine life was put into danger and seafood resources were critical, especially in ovster industry with almost all of the ovster beds totally destroyed by the HAB.

The Coalition's was formed by Gulf Coast Mayors and County Supervisors, along with concerned civic leaders and businesses, and its goal is "to work with state and federal leaders to cause national solutions, provide public education on the subject, and if necessary, engage in litigation to restore the Mississippi Sound, to recover damages for affected parties, and mandate national solutions."


