- 2. SVDG and Lions of MS Sight Foundation member Lion Penny explained the Foundation's fundraising project '20 Guns in 20 Days' Raffle Tickets and that she has 60 raffle ticket books to distribute to the Biloxi Club members. Each book has 6 tickets, tickets are \$20 each or the whole book for \$100. The drawing will start on Nov. 1st
- 3. District 30S LCIF Coordinator Lion Carl reported on the Moss Point tornado disaster relief grant. Approximately \$2000 of the \$10K grant was used for the ice chests, cooling towels and 2x4s. 15 ice chests are still available for distribution, however, the urgent need for assistance for the chests is dwindling down. There is still a need to distribute ice and water, all donated, and volunteers are still needed to see that ice and water is made available to those persons. With no further cause to purchase additional relief items, the grant was closed out last week and any unused funds are being returned to LCIF

- 5. **Program:** Pres. Jerry introduced today's guest speaker, Rick Burris, Chief Scientific Officer with the MS Department of Marine Resources. Photo below. Apologies in advance...the photo taken of Lion Jerry and Rick together was accidentally deleted and is not available

The MS Department of Marine Resources (DMR)

The last time Rick Burris, Chief Scientific Officer, of the DMR was able to speak to the Biloxi Lions Club was in 2019 on damage the algae-bloom was causing the coastal waters natural resources.

Today's slide-show program highlighted what the DMR is about and what programs it is undertaking through its mission. Created in 1994 by the MS Legislature with the mission to enhance, protect and conserve the state's marine interest.

Currently the department manages over 43,000 acres of sensitive coastal wetlands habitats; 5 trail systems within the 3 coastal counties; and coordinates the Wetlands Permitting process of over 800 applications annually for waterfront construction and wetland impact requests within the 3 coastal counties.

The department also administers the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) grant funding, which can be used for projects and activities for the purpose of coastal protection, conservation, restoration, hurricane protection and infrastructure directly affected by coastal wetland losses; Mitigation of damage to fish, wildlife or natural resources; Implementation of a federally-approved marine, coastal or conservation management plan; Migration of the impact of activities through funding of onshore infrastructure projects; Planning assistance and the administrative costs of complying with this section of not more than 3%. DMR awarded more than \$10M in Tideland grants to enhance cities, counties, and state properties along the MS Gulf Coast.

The Marine Patrol force of 31 officers and 24 patrol boats cover over 14,000 square miles of waterways and through the Department of Homeland Security, the Office of Marine Patrol provides security to keep ports and harbors safe. Through the Office of Marine Fisheries DMR provides for the effective management of marine fisheries with 5 Bureaus: Artificial Reef; Finfish, Seafood Technology; Shellfish; Shrimp and Crab; and Aquaculture Hatchery. Funded by GOMESA a newly established Microbiology Laboratory to help with 2 types of Analysis: Fecal Coliform Analysis and HAB (Hard the 2023 Reef Accessment by 75).

In the Shellfish Bureau, DMR has completed the 2023 Reef Assessment by 75 1-minute dredge tows over approximately 160 acres, 70 farmers have graduated from MDMR training for Off-Bottom Oyster Aquaculture; 465 areas of currently available for commercial farming; 68 acres currently leased by 35 farmers; Off-Bottom oyster aquaculture commercial operations have harvested just over 1M oysters, equivalent to 3,925 sacks of oysters. Because of the damage to the oyster reefs in 2019 caused by Harmful Algae Bloom Senate Bill 2544 during the MS Legislature 2023 Regular Session update it On-Bottom Shellfish regulations. The primary overall goal of SB2544 is promote the prosperity of coastal communities and foster a thriving shellfish industry in the state.

The 2023 MS Crab Season revealed that through June 2023 over 398,000 pounds of crab were landed with a dockside value near \$1M.

Rick finished the presentation with the Aquaculture Hatchery slide. In 2006 the 23 acre of lined and earthen ponds Fish Hatchery, located in Lyman, was given to DMR. While it cost over \$100K annually in salt to turn the freshwater into a saltwater hatchery, in 2023 over 100K Spotted Seatrout were released in each of the 3 coastal counties, in addition, 4K 6"-8" and 2K 13"-15" Seatrout have been released.
