The 2023 was very convenient for many USA and Canadian Lions as held in Boston, MA July 7-11, 2023.

The Boston LICCon held a special meaning for one particular Biloxi Lion as he was attending as a District Governor in training. Biloxi's Past President Elijah Mitchell became the Lions of MS District 30S First Vice District Governor on July 1 and was recognized with the other First District Governors from around the world on Boston.

1. Pres. Jerry's Announcements:

activities conventioneers find to do on their own.

However, if you are one of the many Lions that are taking part in leadership roles, such as the District Governor training, then the above description of a typical convention may still hold true but with the added activity of attending meetings with your peers.

FVDG Elijah shared his Boston LICCon experience by saying "it's hard to put 6 days into 20 minutes." He stated that the road to get there was a bit bumpy starting with making the reservations, the flight delays, and finally arriving at his hotel later in the evening than planned only to find that his assigned room had not been cleaned.

The next morning after a good evening meal, a clean room, and a good night sleep Lion Elijah said the host welcoming committee assigned to met the visiting Lions were outstanding. "The convention center was huge and without Lion guides stationed in strategic locations it would have been hard to get where you needed to go on time." He expanded on the subject by saying "I learned the hard way when I was contacted by District 3oS District Governor Tom Corlett asking 'where are you? You're supposed to be in this meeting now.' The facility was so large golf carts were used to transport from one area to another, and I had to have a golf cart transport me to the meeting room on the other end of the facility, nearly a mile away." But this convention was "A tremendous Blessing for me...inspirational, educational and fun!"

Next he had a couple of questions for BLC members (club members in leadership positions were not to answer)

- 1) The Name of the New International President Is? After a few hints, it still wasn't answered... A: Dr. Patti Hill
- 2) What is the President's theme? Several great answers but none completely correct...A: Changing the World

FVDG Elijah continued by explaining as the world's largest service organization with 1.4m members we have to adapt to make changes for future membership growth so that the Lions Clubs International can Change the World. We need to tell our story to the world about our work in the LCI Eight Global Causes: DIABETES, VISION, HUNGER, ENVIRONMENT, YOUTH, DISASTER RELIEF, HUMANITARIAN and CHILDHOOD CANCER. We need to be bold with calculated risk and be brave, to have the courage to change things we can change.

A new question was asked: What is the President's goal for 2023-2024? A: Her goal Mission 1.5 A Mission Challenge for members to achieve a global members of 1.5 million members by 2027.

A short You Tube video of International President Patti Hill on Mission 1.5 was to be shown at this time. However, the Seafood Museums internet refused to cooperate with our laptop in providing sound to the video.

You can watch the video on your own by going to You Tube for "LCI Mission 1.5 | Dr Patti Hill International President". You will be glad you watched this video. As a member you will want to take up her Challenge of Mission 1.5.

In closing, FVDG Elijah reiterated that for the action plan for Mission 1.5 to be successful:

- 1) All members need to engage and invite (ask) people to become new members
- 2) Clubs are dying, whether due to age, health, employment, or lack of commitment, we need to keep those alive and also form new clubs
- 3) Bottom Line: JUST ASK!
- 4) The BIGGEST change starts with YOU and ME, Right Here! Right Now!
