Samuel T. Redd, Jr. has served his beloved hometown for more than twenty years as the Executive Director of Operation P.U.L.S.E. a faith based public safety initiative designed to have a positive impact in removing crime and violence from the East Baltimore community.



Mr. Redd is often called upon to speak in public forums, seminars and training classes on crime prevention and faith-based initiatives. Sam's experience and passion in serving the community has afforded him the opportunity to be requested and appointed to serve on the mayor's transition team. Additionally, Sam's keen knowledge has been instrumental in bridging the gap between businesses, schools, churches, law enforcement agencies and the community.

Under Sam Redd's leadership, P.U.L.S.E. has received numerous citations and awards from governors, mayors, United States House of Representatives, United States Senate and community groups as well as other organizations and institutions. During a formal ceremony in April 2016, Mr. Redd accepted on behalf of Operation P.U.L.S.E., as the state of Maryland's recipient of the FBI Director's Community Leadership Award for 2015.

Sam is a promoter of crime prevention and safety, community cohesiveness and partnership. With every event, workshop and every annual community activity planned, he seeks to galvanize volunteers and community partners to display that "we are all in it together" building and maintaining a safe environment to live, work, worship, go to school and play. Every year, he hosts one of Baltimore's biggest and well attended National Night Out Against Crime block parties, supports multiple communities with back-to-school supplies as well as spearheads a Pre-Thanksgiving Community Dinner and Awards Worship Service all through community partnerships. Sam's goals have been and are still, to continue to make East Baltimore and Baltimore City as a whole a safe place to work, worship, matriculate and live.

ANNUAL EVENTS



One of the highlights of participating in the community is the reward of giving back to the community. Operation P.U.L.S.E. has sponsored several events that draw community partners together to provide services, support and solutions for our surrounding communities.

National Night Out Against Crime

Operation P.U.L.S.E. participates annually as a local sponsor of National Night Out which is designed to: (1) Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness; (2)



Generate support for, and participation in, local anti-crime efforts; (3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and (4) Send a message to criminals letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. Annual Night Out Against Crime continues to grow with collaboration,

participation and attendance making it one of Baltimore's largest and well attended NNO events. Entrance to the events is always free due to the large collaboration with our community partners.

Annual Back to School Back Pack & School Supplies Give Away

Each year together with community partners, we have been able to support students in our communities by giving out fully packed backpacks filled with school supplies giving students a jumpstart on being prepared to have a great academic school year.

During the shutdown due to the pandemic, Pulse was able to give 100 students tablets to assist in their virtual education.



Annual Pre-Thanksgiving Community Dinner & Awards Service

Each year we join with multiple



churches, businesses and community groups in our city to serve a full Thanksgiving dinner to those who otherwise may not have a Thanksgiving Dinner. This annual community dinner continues to grow to serve over 300 people each year with

one year serving over 500 people. Additionally, during the worship service that follows the dinner, we take time to acknowledge some well deserving community residents, public safety officials, educators, public and/or elected officials, volunteers and community partners who work tirelessly to make our city a better and safer place to live. We have recognized a police officer as police officer of the year from the Eastern District, a security officer of the year from Johns Hopkins Public Safety, as well as organizations have been recognized for their altruism and dedication to serve their communities and to make a difference. We are additionally able to give-out over 200 Turkeys due the faithful partnership with Baltimore Ravens.

P.U.L.S.E. did not let the pandemic cancel this annual event. We were ble to feed over 300 people with the traditional Thanksgiving meal curbside to keep every ones safe in 2020 and 2021.

Save a Life Series

This new series is a quarterly effort collaborating with multiple community partners focused on being of support to the community by way of enlightenment, resources, training and services. We have hosted Overdose Response Trainings (Narcan) which is in response to the national opioid epidemic that plagues our city. Additionally, we have hosted a "Curb the Crisis with Curbside Drug Drop Off" for safe disposal of prescription drugs. Other planned trainings a part of the Save the life Series are "Stop the Bleed", Human Trafficking Awareness, CPR Training & Blood Pressure Diabetes Screening.
