


Did you know?

The need for accessible and effective education solutions in rural Africa is immense.


According to new calculations, to reach education goals by 2030, sub-Saharan Africa will need to recruit a 15 million teachers. - UNESCO

Notable milestones include the establishment of the Waka Social Scholarship Fund.


