

OUR PROGRAMS

In-Home Services – our professional staff delivers vocational rehabilitation and training in independent living skills to older blind or visually impaired individuals who are not likely to be employed by reason of their age. After an initial assessment, staff develop individualized care plans, setting goals with input with the client.

A "lending library" and free distribution of low-vision devices and equipment (including CCTV and JAWS-equipped computers) is available for training purposes and for inhome use by clients.

Group Classes – and Activities help meet the need for recreation and socialization. These include programs in music, exercise, current events, nutrition and cooking skills for the blind, arts and crafts as well as weekly support groups, holiday parties and field trips.

Our Early Detection & Intervention Program, offers free vision screenings targeted at low-income communities to identify seniors at risk of degenerative eye disease. Once we have identified those with visual impairments and determined their level of risk, we provide follow-up case management to make sure they get the care they need to prevent or delay vision loss and maintain independence.
