

Reading at Home



Little Wandle Scheme Books

Your child will bring home their new Little Wandle book each **Friday**. They will read it in school three times and we would like you to support your child with reading at home. There are practise sounds, words and new vocabulary to discuss on the inside cover to 'warm up' and then questions about the book at the back to develop their comprehension skills.

This book **must** be returned to school the following **Friday**.

Class Library Books

Your child is able to pick a book out of our class library daily. This a book for you to read together, to promote a love of reading and of stories.

Spellings



The children will shortly be given a log in for Spelling Shed. The children will be assigned a number of words, matched to the Little Wandle scheme, which they will learn to spell through interactive games at home.

This login will be glued to your reading record tomorrow.

Composition and Effect

sequences sentences to form short narratives.

re-reads every sentence to check it make sense.

discusses their writing with adults, saying what is good and what can be improved.

says and can hold in memory (while writing) simple sentences which make sense.


writes simple sentences that can be read by themselves and others.

begins to punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.

uses a capital letter for names of people, places, the days of the week and the personal pronoun 'l'.

Spoken Language

A prime focus in Year 1 is learning to read and write. However, before children can successfully do both they need to be able to speak confidently. Therefore, it is beneficial if there is plenty of opportunity for talk at home:

- Those chats in the car and supermarkets are just as important as those longer dinner time conversations.
- Modelling and gently correcting grammar and pronunciation.

Maths

We follow the White Rose Maths Scheme of Learning. This term, our units of work are as follows:

- Place value (Within 10)
- Addition and Subtraction (Within 10)
- Geometry (Shape)
- Place Value (Within 20)



In addition, we will also be following the NCETM Mastering Number material to support our children in developing mathematical fluency.

Schoolgateway App



We have introduced School Gateway to Great Crosby – a parent/carer engagement app that will allow you to pay for school dinners, school trips and any other fees, and allow us to communicate with you efficiently.

School Gateway has replaced Pay360. All online payments will be made through this system. If you pay for school dinners online, you should already have registered. School Gateway will be replacing GroupCall in the new year.

Please download the app for free. Just search **School Gateway** in your App store and download. Your login details will be automatically generated using the contact information the school already has, so <u>please make sure the details we hold for you are up to date.</u>

You will open the app, click **Sign up**, enter the email address the school has for you, enter your mobile number, and click **Send PIN**. Wait for the text message with the PIN to arrive, enter your PIN and then you can log in. There is also a web-based version if you do not have a smart phone. Please use the app if possible as it makes it easier to get hold of parents/carers when we need to.


