Hello and welcome to Year One!

We have spent a few days getting to know the children and allowing them to familiarise themselves with our school Mission Statement.

Here is a brief outline of our curriculum for this term and how you can continue to support your child at home.

	How you can help:
English	-
Labels, lists and captions	-When reading non-fiction books, discuss any labels, lists and captions
Senses poetry	- Discuss your child's senses with them and help them to explore lots of different materials through taste, sight, touch etc.
Instructions	- Follow instructions (playing a game / following a recipe etc.) and discuss how they are put together e.g. a list of what you need, numbered points in the correct order
Stories with familiar settings	- Share books set in places your child has been and discuss what happened while they were there.
Maths	
Number Bonds to 5, 10, 6, 7, 8 and then 9	- Number bonds are numbers that combine to make another number. Begin by playing games to learn all the Number Bands to 5 (0+5 / 1+4 / 2+3 / 3+2 / 4+1 / 5+0)
Number – counting, adding and	- Count as many different objects as you can! Combine
subtraction	two groups of objects
Money – coin recognition, making	- Tip your purse out! Look for loose change and see how
different amounts	much is there. Give your child some money to spend in the shop and help them to find the right amounts.
Shape space and measure - longer/	- Look for shapes around the home. Why have they been
shorter, heavier/lighter, wide/narrow	used for that object? e.g. a football will roll.
Data handling – sorting, pictograms	- Help your child to write numbers correctly - in the sand
and block graphs	at the beach, painting, drawing, making them out of playdough etc.
Time — recognise and use time	- Discuss times of your child's day e.g. when they have
wocabulary and learn o'clock times	breakfast, go to bed etc.

Families	- Gather photos of your family
	- Talk about the people in your family

Belanging	- Discuss any groups or clubs that the children belong to

	- Discuss the importance of belonging to God's family

W -tr	- Discuss times of waiting and how children feel while

	- Discuss the importance of Advent and how we wait for
	the coming of Jesus using Advent wreaths and calendars

Seasanal Changes	- Discuss the changes in the seasons. Why are so many
	things you enjoy doing dependent on the time of the year
Matariala	and the weather?
Materials	- Discuss different objects and the materials they are
	made out of and why

Computing	
Algorithms	- Together, make a set of simple instructions for others to follow (e.g. directions to cross the living room and to go around any obstacles)
Art and Design	
Self Portraits	- Look at portraits by Van Gogh - Look at photographs of the family. What do they say about them?
	- Visit the Art Gallery. What do the portraits tell us about the person?
	(Walker Art Gallery portrait trails are excellent!)
Moving Pictures	- Look at how these are operated e.g. in pop up books and cards
Geography	
Weather and the Seasons	- Discuss seasonal changes and indicators of seasonal change
	- Collect different colour leaves and compare and discuss
PE	
'Move it Monday!' – Stamina building	- Encourage your children to run, walk, jump, etc. different distances
Dance — Scarecrow dance	- Think of the way a scarecrow might move in the fields
Music	
Matching Pitch	- Explore sounds made by untuned instruments, voice or any household object. How do we make a noise with it?
Charanga — Hey You!	e.g. tap, shake, bang, twist etc.
