Collecting shells doubling activity. You will need 2 buckets or 2 tubs, 10 or more shells or stones.

Put 2 shells in one bucket and 2 shells in the other bucket. Count the shells to find the double. Double 2 is ? Write it as a sum 2+2=4 Put 4 shells in one bucket and 4 shells in the other bucket. Count the shells to find the double. Double 4 is ? Write it as a sum 4+4=8 Find the doubles for other amounts of shells.

Physical

60 Second Challenge!

How many times can you throw a beanbag into a hoop in 60 seconds?

Equipment: A beanbag and a hoop

A minute timer or stopwatch on a phone

If you do not have a beanbag or a hoop why not use a washing basket and a rolled up pair of socks instead.

Stand 3 large steps away from the hoop behind a line and throw the beanbag into the hoop. You need to collect the beanbag and return to the throwing line each time you throw.

Get someone to shout 'Go' and 'Stop' when your time is up. Record how many throws you achieve.

Achieve Gold: 15 throws Achieve Silver: 10 throws Achieve Bronze: 5 throws

Think about the shapes you need to use for your boat. Can you name the shapes you have used? Talk about the properties of your shapes. For example, how many sides does it have? Are they straight or curved? How many corners?	Play the game 'Kim's Game' Choose about 8 small items to put on a tray, you can choose anything e.g sunglasses, a pen or pencil, a coin, a straw, a piece of fruit etc Look at the items for a minute and then cover them with a cloth or tea towel. Now someone has to take an item away without you seeing which one it is! Look at the items again. Can you guess what is missing? Play again. Remember to take turns and be patient while you are waiting for your turn. Can you think of any clues to help someone who is finding it difficult to think of the missing item? Such as 'You can use this to write with.'
