


Teach
adding suffixes -ful, -less and -ly to words.

If a suffix starts with a consonant letter it is added straight on to most root words without any change to the last letter of those words.

Examples:

Careful	Hopeless	Badly
Peaceful	Timeless	Sadly
Successful	Careless	Mostly
Fearful	Fearless	Costly
Mindful	Powerless	Calmly
Shameful	Endless	Kindly
Powerful	Useless	lonely
Playful	Restless	lively

Adding -ful, -less and -ly to words ending in a -y.

Rule - if a root word ends in a -y with a constant before it but only if the root word has more than one syllable. Change the -y to an -i then add the suffix.

Examples:

plenty - plentiful

lazy - lazily

penny - penniless

beauty - beautiful

happy - happily

easy - easily

mercy - merciful

busy - busily
