“Give it Up!”

What have you “given up” for Lent? In the Gospel for Lent 2, Jesus makes some bold statements. He invites anyone who wants to follow him to “deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. Those who want to save their life will lose it and those who lose their life for my sake and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.” Mark 8:34b – 35. It is an all or nothing offer. It follows Jesus' statement about what he is going to do and allow to happen to him for the sake of the world and all who live in it.

This text and others have lead to the discipline of lent which many of us have participated in throughout the years. For some it is a self discipline which offers a chance to improve our lives, giving up tobacco, alcohol, sweets, or other things which can have a detrimental effect on us. Continued on page 2...

Act of Contrition


O My God,

Some of us over the years have been successful to a point but have not been able to remain disciplined enough to give up permanently those things which we do not want in our lives. This can lead to frustration and a “why bother” attitude. I would encourage you to keep trying- remembering this self discipline is good for us.

When we hear the words of Jesus, we can be assured of his ability to keep his discipline for our sake. He did all that he said he would. His work for us allows us to fail in our attempts and encourages us to keep trying. If you feel that you can't give something up perhaps you could take up something new. Could you set aside a few minutes to pray for someone or a situation happening in the world? Would you be able to spend a few minutes talking with or listening to a child or an elder? Are you able



to divert money that would buy some small treat for yourself and help someone get the basics for themselves. Perhaps this type of discipline will stick with us as we continue after Lent.

The meeting began at 7:00 pm. Diane Hammel, Council Chair welcomed the Council Members and Treasures present and also a special guest Susan Dupuis – Organ Restoration Committee, (Worship and Music Chair).

Pat Wegner then proceeded with opening devotions - a reading followed with a prayer.

Agenda: Approved as amended. Moved by Cheryl Sack. Seconded by Ellen Vandersleen. Carried.

Special Request: Susan Dupuis addressed Church Council on behalf of the Organ Restoration Committee.

There will be an Organ Rededication and celebration event on Sunday January 28th, 2018. This will not be a fund raising event but a celebration of the completion of the first phase of our Organ Restoration Project. Additional work will be required in the next 5-10 years. There will be three organists participating in this upcoming celebration: Blaine Sack, Fred Haak and Kevin Niemen. The event will begin at 3:00 pm followed by a catered dinner.

The Organ Restoration Committee is requesting permission from Church Council to serve **one glass** of wine at the upcoming dinner on January 28th, 2018. At the Committees' last fund raiser (a Lasagne Dinner), one glass of wine was served to the guests attending only if they requested wine with their meal. A liquor licence is required for this upcoming event. Susan Dupuis explained the distribution procedures used at the last fundraiser, the quantities of wine used and after discussion and consideration Church Council members agreed. Permission was granted. Wine will be served at this special celebration event.

Susan Dupuis thanked Church Council for their time and departed from this meeting

Finance: Gerry Vandersleen reported.

Copies of the Zion Lutheran Church Budget 2018 were distributed to all Council Members present. This budget sheet displayed the past 2016 Budget figures, 2016 Actual figures, 2017 Budget, 2017

Actual figures and finally the proposed 2018 Budget. Since our last Council meeting in December there have been a few changes made to the then proposed budget. Slight adjustments have been made to the Natural Gas, Elevator Maintenance and Insurance Accounts as well as the Revenue Accounts- (Offerings and Parish Hall Rental). The Surplus for this year (2017) is \$8,271.45.

Motion 01-09-2018-01

Moved by Cheryl Sack, Seconded Bill Kennedy. Carried.

We so move to accept the budget for 2018 as presented by Gerry Vandersleen as per attached budget sheet.

This budget will now be presented to the congregation at the next Annual Meeting at the end of February - early March for congregational approval.

We now have a surplus from 2016 of \$ 10,138.74 plus a surplus for this past year 2017 of \$8,271.45. After discussion of some of the issues we are currently having with our own heating system and existing Synod projects the following motion was made.

Motion 01-19-2018-02

Moved by Joel Nieman. Seconded Dan Dole. Carried.

We so move to distribute the \$18,377.93 surplus of 2016/2017 as follows: \$2,000.00 to the Reformation Challenge, \$11,377.92 to the Building Fund and \$5,000.00 keep as a surplus.

Pastor's Report- January 2018

- December had a number of different worship opportunities. The Prelude to Christmas on December 10, our Children's' Christmas Worship on December 17th, celebrating Advent 4 on the 23rd of December and the celebration of Christmas Eve on December 24th with our multiple services that day. All were well attended and seemed to go well.
- In the midst of all the preparations for worship in December I was engaged with trying to visit as many of our homebound members as possible as well as the normal work load of Pastor at Zion.
- I took some holiday time from December 25 to January 4 with Pastor Bruce Thompson providing pastoral care during that time. Pastor Bev Nitshcke provided worship leadership on Sunday January 31. There was no worship on December 30.
- A major event coming up will be the rededication of the pipe organ on Sunday January 28 including a concert and dinner.
- We will begin the observance of Lent on February 14 with Ash Wednesday and the following 5 weeks of mid week services. This year the theme will be the passion story of Jesus leading up to the crucifixion.
- In regards to the employment agreement process I will be getting my police record check started and take the proscribed personal boundaries course as called for in the guidelines. Personnel Committee is in the process of redefining the pastor/s job description with one Pastor serving Zion.

Addition Comments:

- Pastor also conducted worship at Miramichi Lodge Christmas Eve morning.
- There will be no pulpit exchange during Lent.

Correspondence:

A **Thank you card** addressed to the Council Members and Pastor Paul was read. A heartfelt thank you was expressed to the ones leaving the Council family and for those staying on Council- these Council Members will continue to be in the congregation's prayers.

A **Thank you card** addressed to the congregation of Zion and Church Council was read from Blaine Sack thanking the congregation for his Christmas card and his Christmas Bonus.

Committee Reports:

Property: Gerry Vandersleen reported.

House Rentals: All units are rented and payments are presently up to date but prompting to the tenants is required.

Organ Blower Room: A furnace-type filter will be installed to reduce the possibility of foreign material entering the organ blower system. There is disagreement over the installation site. This issue should be resolved at the end of January 2018 when the Casavant Reps return to attend the January 28th, 2018 celebrations.

Snow Removal: The Property Committee is recommending that the front steps be kept shovelled. The yard snow-removal contract performance is positive. Issues if they exist are resolved.

Door Seals: Door seals on various doors have been replaced but some require follow-up attention and/ or work. This will be done in the near future.

Heating System: Heating issues were experienced in the Sanctuary and the Parish Hall over the past few weeks. Recommendations and quotes have been requested from contractors to address our aging equipment issues.

New Armstrong valve replacement for the Parish Hall is currently in progress with some of the valves already replaced.

Christmas Trees (Sanctuary): Trees will be removed on Thursday January 11th, 2018.

Old Computers in Church Office: These computers have been replaced with new ones. The old computers will be recycled.

Repair to the Lower Roof (Elevator Entrance): Repairs have been completed by Adanac Roofing at a cost \$12,743.00 plus HST.

Speed Bump: The speed bump in the elevator entrance parking lot has been removed for the season.

Keys: The rekeying of Church locks is an expensive venture and is on hold. For a short period of time everything may go well and then we could have the same key issues. A security system is in place now.

Council Members were reminded by Council Chair of the wording in the Parish Hall/Room(s)/Sanctuary Rental Agreement in place. All Council Members have a copy of this agreement. A key deposit of \$25.00 is to be paid prior to the event. These deposits will be returned to the individual or group after the event once the hall/room is checked for damages. If the issued key is not returned, the key deposit will not be returned, and there will be an additional charge to cover the cost of changing the locks. This charge will reflect the cost the church incurs for this expense.

Next Property Committee Meeting is February 20th, 2018 at 7:00 pm.

Social Ministry: Ellen Vandersleen reported.

- The Synod Mission Grant Funds of \$1350.00 have been received.

- On January 16th, 2018 the Social Ministry Committee will meet to prepare a meal for the Boy's and Girl's Club (the main course meatballs and rice), as well as individual meals for the sick and shut-ins in our congregation (meatloaf and soup).
- Vouchers are being arranged for distribution to the Soup Kitchen. 10 vouchers will be distributed each week to our Lenten Suppers. 10 meals will also be prepared for our sick and shut-ins and distributed each Lenten supper week.
- The proceeds from the Shrove Tuesday - Pancake, bean and sausage dinner on February 13th, 2017 will go to the First Step Options / Pregnancy Resource Centre with hopefully a matching grant from Faith Life. The suggested donation for the dinner is \$7.00.
- The proceeds from the remaining Lenten Suppers will be divided between: 1) Zion's Kitchen Fund 2) Zion Furnace- Heating System. 3) Carefor Kitchen
- The Lenten Dinners will start at 5:30 pm and suggested donation is \$14.00 per meal. A mid-week worship service will follow.

Miscellaneous:

The **Annual Meeting date** after discussion is scheduled for **Sunday February 25th, 2018** following the 10:00 am. Worship Service. A Pot Luck Lunch will precede the Congregational Annual Meeting.

Names were suggested for possible Church Council Members to replace the present Council Members who have expiring terms. These people will be contacted and this will be discussed at our next Council meeting in February 2018.



Review of Outstanding Business: Update on the Organ Restoration

A. Phase 1 of the organ restoration is complete. A final celebration event is scheduled for Sunday, January 28, 2018. Several guests, including Jacques Rochette and Robert Hiller from Casavant will be in attendance on Sunday afternoon. Robert was the lead/charge rep from Casavant during the organ restoration project. He also tuned the organ when the project was completed and will be the one who tunes and tweaks anything on Sunday afternoon prior to the Rededication Service. Also, Bill Vineer, an archivist, have been invited and is planning on attending.

B. As December 31, 2017 the balance in the account is approximately 14,000. This will be used for Phase 2 of the organ restoration plan which will need to be completed in the next 5 - 10 years.

World Day of Prayer 2018: Suriname

This year, our World Day of Prayer focus is on the people of Suriname who are very diverse – ethnically, culturally, religiously, and linguistically. Suriname is a small country north of Brazil in South America. Among ten districts, Paramaribo and Wancia account for less than .5% of the total area of Suriname but hold 65% of the population. The service highlights preserving creation so we may continue to hear the words “It is good.”

A major concern for Suriname is gold mining in the Amazon which causes deforestation of their beautiful rainforest and contamination of their rivers and food supply. Populated areas allow families to better educate their children despite an average wage that is less than one-tenth of a miner’s income. Constant hard work in isolated areas erodes family relationships when miners are separated many months of the year. Fatigue leaves workers susceptible to malaria. Standing water left over from sluicing for gold is a perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes that spread malaria. Mercury, used to separate gold from the soil, has contaminated waterways and fish. Crime is also a concern.

Some organizations are working to bring awareness of the ecological impact of mining. Indigenous people are being trained to monitor the mercury levels in fish and water and the results of deforestation. Initiatives, such as handicrafts and agriculture are being introduced to give an alternative, sustainable income.

Let us pray for the people in Suriname, and all people, that we embrace respect for our environment and we continue to say, “All God’s creation is very good!”
