From Pastor Paul

“Lent Again ...”

Well we are at that special time of the year, Lent. As we participate in the observance of this part of the church year we often find ourselves going in the opposite direction of the society in which we live. First we will attend Church on Tuesday evening to eat pancakes and sausage for supper. Why are we doing this? We eat those pancakes because they rise. We eat the sausage/ham because they are meat and usually richly flavoured with spices. We eat these items as a way to end the celebration of Christmas/Epiphany and remind ourselves that Lent is a time of penitence for our sinfulness and that Christ must come to die for us all.

Also during Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday, we again will gather at church this time to receive a cross with ashes on our foreheads. They serve as a reminder that our sins are like the ashes that remain from our fires after the flames have gone out. The

blackness reminds us of our death that is our punishment from the original sin that we have from our ancestral parents Adam & Eve. The cross reminds us that Christ has come to remove that sin from us by his death and resurrection. The tradition is that the ashes are made from the palm branches from the year before, connecting Ash Wednesday and Lent. As Jesus arrives in Jerusalem on that Palm Sunday we are the ones who bear those ash crosses on our brows as we welcome him into his death and resurrection for us.

During the rest of Lent we are called again to focus on an aspect of our faith. We meet on Wednesdays to share a time of worship and examine our faith as we reflect on the ministry of Christ among us. How may we respond to the love that Christ has showered upon us. I used to say that here at Zion, we used to give up fasting as a

discipline during Lent. Now I say that we use the gifts that we have been blessed with to meet the needs of others in the community. We feed the people with food and Word to fill people up with God's love.

Now for the most important things to learn about. What does all this giving up for Lent mean? On Ash Wednesday we are invited into discipline of Lent, that is self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love – strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. We give up something that we do not need to have. We give up those items or activities that can affect us negatively. We give up what can separate us from Christ and each other. Some of what we give up we won't go back to, others can be picked up after Lent and resumed. Now the 40 days of Lent do not include the Sundays. Sundays are always mini celebrations of Easter. These are a few ideas about Lent and how we can observe it with the celebration of Christ's resurrection as the final goal of Lent.

Agenda: The agenda was reviewed. Additions: Social ministry; Prelude to Christmas update.

Minutes: The previous council meeting minutes of November 13, 2018 were reviewed; 2 small corrections. Jane Schizkoske's name was added to the list of members present. A note on needles found in parking lot was left in the minutes.
Motion to approve minutes: Jill Kellough.
Seconded: Rick Gerundin.

Finance Report: Gerry Vandersleen brought attention to the following items from the comparative income statement and balance statement:

- Miscellaneous fund \$10 000 bequest. Gerry inquired re suggestions for use. Scott L. made suggestion to leave in fund for future use. Ellen V. made suggestion to use some funds towards the development of a community garden. Gerry suggested holding the funds at present for future needs.
- Oktoberfest funds will be transferred into stained glass repair fund.
- Total equity is down by half compared to this time last year.
- Regular offerings are down by \$8 000.
- Benevolence fund remains the same.
- Net income is decreased by half as the same time last year.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Paul reported December 2018 activities as follows:

- Pastor Paul attended the Bishop's meeting on November 28th and the evening session as well for congregational members. A discussion was held by Pastor Paul and Susan Dupuis re the Bishop's message on the future of the Lutheran church; many churches

are experiencing fewer members attending church and worship, so it's important for churches to work together.

- The November 24th ministry area meeting was missed in Renfrew due to the funeral of David Roche that day.
- Advent worships events are happening starting with the prelude to Christmas Dec. 9th. The 15th will see us hosting Malcolm Deavitt & Binhammer Christmas service of remembrance at 2PM. The Sunday school will present their Christmas Worship in the parish hall on the 16th followed by a congregation potluck lunch. Members of both choirs will be singing at Calvin United on the 16th at 2PM for the benefit of the Canada Food Grains Bank.
- Pastor Paul held informal talks with the members who worship mostly on Saturdays the last two weekends of November. He spoke about the numbers, the need for volunteers and alternate ideas for a second service. There was some response, and more is expected in the new year with people being invited to share ideas via the worship suggestion boxes.
- The funeral for Delmer "Bud" Miller was held on December 8th.
- Pastor Paul will be in Sudbury from December 25th until December 31st for Christmas holidays. Pastor Jim Goos will lead worship December 30th. There will be no Saturday service that weekend. Pastor Bruce Thompson will be providing pastoral care during that time. Pastor Paul will have the privilege of baptising his grandson on the 30th at Trinity, Sudbury.

Correspondence: No correspondence was received.

Committee Reports:

- **Social Ministry:** Distribution gifts to residents of Carefor will occur on December 12; soup and sandwich luncheon will be held January 13, 2019.
- **Prelude to Christmas:** 68 people attended (attendance down from previous year). Lots of coffee, tea, and snacks were available.

Ongoing Business:

- Request for use of our vacant lot. A request was made to use the vacant lot as a community garden. Gerry made a few suggestions as to where this garden may go (along the back fence). Further input and discussion will be ongoing. Further research will also be required before any decisions are made.
- Community Christmas Dinner will be held on Christmas Day from 12:00-3:00PM. This will be the 11th year of the Community Christmas Dinner.
- Set up of tables for Coffee Hour. A request was made of the sextons to set up the coffee hour tables; not a viable solution at this time.
- Christmas bonus for staff and pastor. Discussion held.
- Annual meeting to be held February 24, 2019.

Adjournment:

The meeting adjourned at 8:45pm and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The next Church Council Meeting is scheduled for January 8th at 7pm.

Opening: The meeting was opened by council chair Susan Dupuis. Opening devotions were given by Susan Dupuis.

Agenda: The agenda was reviewed. Additions: Social ministry, music and worship, property reports.

Minutes: The previous council meeting minutes of December 11, 2018 were reviewed.
Motion to approve minutes: Rick Gerundin.

Finance Report: Gerry Vandersleen brought attention to the following items from the comparative income statement and balance statement:

- Net revenue is down slightly compared to the previous year.
- Total expenses are down.
- Council made the decision to add 2000.00 to the surplus and the remainder to miscellaneous: 5875.00- to cover Call Committee and moving expenses for the new pastor.
- Budget: Gerry presented two scenarios with respect to the budget, with the main discussion centering on payroll and benefit expenses.
Motion to approve budget as presented: Ellen Vandersleen.
Seconded: Diane Leeder.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Paul reported on December 2018 activities as follows.

- December at Zion was very busy. December 9th was the prelude to Christmas program with people invited to bring gifts of food or money for the food bank. On the 15th Zion hosted Malcolm Deavitt and Binhammer's Christmas memorial service which was followed by the 4:30PM service and the celebration of Baptism for Mason MacGregor (Jean and Kevin Rutz's younger grandson). The 16th continued with the Children's Christmas worship service and a congregation potluck lunch.
- Christmas eve Pastor Paul lead worship at Miramichi Lodge for about 40 people. Our 3 services at Zion had a total of 500+ in attendance, down about 150 from last year. Some thoughts about why that could be include Monday people were still working when the earlier

services were offered and we also offered worship Saturday, Sunday, and Monday and people said one day is enough. Perhaps more people were away than normal. With our larger than average number of funerals this year relatives of those who had died were not in attendance.

- We had the 'talk' with the Saturday worship group and perhaps word got around that it might be in jeopardy and the numbers have increased into the high 20's to low 30's. Saturday worship will continue as it has and we will keep having discussions about how to increase and improve worship opportunities.
- Saturday, January 5 was the funeral of Rodney Schultz.
- The season of Lent begins on March 6 with the observance of Ash Wednesday. The Ottawa Valley cluster meets this Thursday and will discuss the possibility of shared worship during mid-week. The date for Easter this year is April 21st.
- At this time, there is only one wedding scheduled for this year. It is Bailey Levair, granddaughter to Diane and Koit Rull, on August 24th.
- A new protocol and training program has been developed for safe boundaries for pastors working with vulnerable populations. Pastor Paul would like to attend this training in May in Ottawa.

Correspondence: A thank you note was received from the Reids for support of their family attending summer camp.

Committee Reports:

- **Social Ministry:** Sunday January 13 will be a soup and sandwich function. Next boys and girls club supper will be January 15; sign-up sheet will be available for donations.
- **Music and Worship:** Saturday evening services will remain as is for now. Some changes may occur this summer for the mid-week services. Pastor Paul suggested extending the invite for mid-week summer services to other parishes and pastors.
- **Property:** Hot water and steam boilers have been turned on and working fine. The quilters room is still very warm; the solution will be to wrap all heating pipes in the quilters, janitorial, storage and furnace rooms. Christmas tree removal will be done on Thursday. Snow removal is going well. Signs will be purchased for the hall wall on the parking lot side to warn of possible falling snow or ice. Pastor Paul inquired re the purchase of an electronic sign for the front of the church; it would be a good way to advertise upcoming church functions and happenings in the church. Council members were interested in this idea. Cheryl raised some concerns regarding the audio system; Gerry will look into. Ellen discussed the possibility of a system which would help those with hearing impairments; Scott will bring the discussion to the music and worship committee.

Ongoing Business:

- Request for use of property for a meeting of the executive of the Pembroke Horticultural Society; request had been approved.
- AGM for Pembroke Horticultural Society is scheduled for April 13.

Adjournment:

Welcome and Opening Devotions: Gayle welcomed everyone and thanked Koit for joining the committee. Opening devotions were led by Pastor Paul.

Approval of Previous Month's Minutes: Completed online

Approval of Agenda: Approved unanimously

Committee reports:

Pastor Paul

- The worship liturgy will be changed soon.
- Pastor Tiina Cote from Calvin United Church invited our congregation to participate in a series of worship services called "Taize". These services involve worship, music and a meal. They would allow area congregations to come together for worship and fellowship. When and where the services will occur have not been finalized. More information will be provided when available.
- Pancake Tuesday - March 5
- Midweek Lenten Services begin on March 6. They will not be a shared ministry this year. Congregations that do not have midweek services will be invited to join us at Zion.
- As per the suggestion brought forward at the November 27th W & M meeting, Pastor Paul and Blaine will meet to discuss how to change up the service format on occasion.

Blaine Sack: Church Musician

- Reviewing and sorting old music is almost completed. Blaine found several anthems that can be used by the choirs. He is in the process of organizing the music by season.
- A schedule for when choirs and guest musicians will share their musical talents with the

congregation is made.

- Blaine will share some new musical selections during Saturday services.
- This year is the 50th anniversary of the organ and a special service to commemorate the occasion is being planned.
- Blaine noted the organ was dedicated in 1968 but the placard on the main chest of the organ is dated 1969. Blaine looked into this discrepancy and found the organ's installation started in 1968 but the work was completed and the organ dedication was held in the summer of 1969. Thus, the year 1969 is on the gold plate affixed to the main wind chest that houses the pipes of the Great manual. This date also coincides with what is on the placard that is affixed to the console.
- Concerns with the sound system will be addressed with Mike Montaigne in February.

Other Business:

- **Sextons**
 - Koit Rull has volunteered to help with Sextons. He has completed the schedule for February and shared it with Gayle, Pastor Paul and the church office. Additional helpers are needed. So far, 2 individuals have agreed to shadow Koit to learn what is involved with being a sexton and hopefully agree to help with this important part of our worship service. Presently, there are only 2 sextons available for funerals.
- **Donation for a Grand Piano**
 - A generous donation has been received from Gerry Binhammer. The money will be put in a special fund for purchase of a grand piano. Gayle will send Gerry a thank you note.
- **Dedication of the Inshallah Songbooks**
 - In June, Pastor Paul and Joan donated Inshallah songbooks for the choirs. We would like to recognize their generosity and dedicate the books during both the Saturday and Sunday services at the end of February.
