

Around Lake Chad, the entire water cycle has been disrupted. The lake itself shrunk between the 1960s and 1990s to a fraction of its previous size, and rainfall has become lighter and more erratic. Droughts have increased, irrigation channels have been damaged, drinking water polluted, and native fish species have disappeared.

In the Lake Chad region, <u>climate</u> change is making water more unpredictable. Sudden rains cause <u>rivers</u> to flood, damaging homes and farmland. As the water rushes over dry ground, it causes <u>erosion</u>, wearing away soil and weakening the land. As the land becomes drier, the risk of <u>desert</u> expansion grows. But communities are responding. They're planting <u>trees</u> to protect water sources and soil, building smarter <u>irrigation</u> systems, and collecting <u>rainwater</u> for future use. These efforts help people <u>conserve</u> water, <u>share</u> it fairly, and care for the <u>ecosystem</u> that supports them.

Committee Reports:

Pastor Scott:

- October 12th Setting Eight will begin
