From the Pastor's Desk

Pastor's Musings: **An Ecstatic Epiphany!**

Epiphany follows immediately after the 12 days of Christmas. The word *epiphany* means "revelation" or "showing forth" or "manifestation." During Epiphany we observe the manifestation of God in Christ to all the nations of the world. God has appeared. God is revealed to the Wise Men as the child Jesus, and later as an adult when he is baptized, anointed with the Holy Spirit and called God's beloved Son. The Season of Epiphany runs from January 6 to Ash Wednesday, February 17. During Epiphany we reflect upon being children of light.

This time in the Church is also about how God's glory is revealed in Christ, and this is particularly so on the final Sunday in Epiphany Season which is always celebrated as the Transfiguration of our Lord. This amazing event is about Jesus' journey to the mountaintop with four of his disciples where he is transfigured before them, revealing again God's glory and his identity as God's Son as it is once more proclaimed from the heavens.

(Pastor's Musings: An Ecstatic Epiphany! Cont'd)

So as we continue on this journey through the Season of Epiphany, what are your "Aha" moments? When do you experience a revelation of God? In the gospel stories, these events typically happen in ordinary settings with ordinary people, not necessarily with religious leaders in a place of worship. I encourage you to continue to be open to God's revelation **to you wherever you are!**

The other thing to note with these revelations of Jesus is that it changes those who experience it. So again, I encourage you to reflect upon how your experiences of God's revelations have changed you. Or maybe consider also how epiphanies for others have transformed their lives.

During this time of pandemic with its constantly changing ways of living and interacting, one thing I am constantly marveling at is how God continues to reveal God's presence and activity, especially in the simple and ordinary things of life. As 2026 unfolds, even with the unexpected things that happen....God is at work. God is in control. And God is all about surprising us and revealing God to us. And just maybe, like the Wise Men who were warned in a dream to avoid the dangers of the current political power and returned home by another way, we too may find our ways being changed and having to readjust our plans. But we too will find our way home, as God continues to lead and guide us. I look forward to hearing about your Ecstatic Epiphanic Experiences!






Messy Church

Welcome and Opening Devotions: Gayle welcomed everyone and Pastor Scott opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Agenda: Addition of Licensing

Approval of Last Meeting's Minutes: Done on-line.

Committee Reports:

Pastor Scott:

Worship and Music:

- Canadian Advent candles were ordered this year.
- The Christ Candle for the wreath will need to be ordered next year.
- Candlelight Service candles were ordered last year.
- Traditional Advent Services in December are prepared with the exception of December 21st.
- December 21st will be the participatory Christmas program.
- Christmas Eve Services are just about ready.
- On December 14th, Candles and Carols will be held again. This is an opportunity to sing favourite carols and learn a little bit of the history behind them. Since Blaine cannot attend, the organist from Ladysmith-Schwartz will be playing. She will also be bringing her fiddle. A stipend should be given to her. The committee agreed on \$75.00.

Blended Service:

I have thought long and hard about this service.

- Due to many factors the Blended Service will no longer happen.
- The result of the decision to cancel blended services altogether is that out of 63 services in a year, 6 will be Living Stones Services. Many months the services in the Parish Hall are cancelled due to the liturgical year schedule or the picnic.
- Attendance at the Blended Service on November 16th was lower than the average weekly attendance and lower than when two individual services are separate and numbers added together.

- There will be 6 Living Stones Services in 2026. If people think that not having the Living Stones Service will translate to all those members who normally worship at the Living Stones Service moving to the sanctuary they are wrong. The primary important factor in all of this is that people are worshipping God wherever they are, the sanctuary or the fellowship hall.

Organ:

- The organ will be tuned on Friday, December 5th.

Piano:

- The Yamaha grand piano in the sanctuary will be tuned on Monday, December 8th.
- The Baldwin grand piano on the stage in the Parish Hall is played less frequently. It has held its tune well and will not be serviced at this time.
- The humidifiers in the church will help increase (somewhat) the level of humidity during the cold, dry days of winter. This will help the instruments by preventing the wood from drying out and/or cracking and also help keep the instruments in tune longer.

- December 14th (Advent 3) - Men's choir
- December 21st (Advent 4) - Potluck lunch following the Christmas Pageant. Special music will be played using the Baldwin grand piano in the Parish Hall.

3:00 pm - Mixed Choir 7:00 pm - Men's Choir

- Guest soloist Kara Buelow-Fleck will share special music at one of the Christmas Eve services.
- December 28th - Guest soloist Maria Merredew will share special music.
- January 4th - Men's choir may possibly sing at a special afternoon Epiphany worship service.

Worship services:

Midweek morning quiet communion:

- Possible service at 10:30 am on Wednesday, December 10th with Christmas carols and songs (to be confirmed).

Hymn Sings:

- Possible “Carol Sing” before the Sunday service on December 28th (to be confirmed).

Blended Services:

- I look forward to celebrating these services more frequently in the sanctuary.
- A guitar accompaniment edition of the new All Creation Sings (ACS) supplement has been purchased for the Living Stones Band so more of the ‘contemporary’ songs can be learned and sung during blended worship.
- The ACS resource should be used more during special services. This is a request from the congregation.
- Hymns and songs from the ACS have been sung during regular worship services and hymn sings. They have also been shared as prelude/postlude and other special music during services.

Christmas Services:**Ushers:**

- There will be 4 ushers at both of the Christmas Eve services. Cheryl will arrange to have the collection plates passed during these services.

Worship Assistants:

- Lorraine reported that worship assistants for the Christmas services have been arranged.

Sextons:

- Koit confirmed that ushers have been arranged for the Christmas services.

Flowers and Candles:

- Sandra will order 2 large poinsettias. There are enough candles so none

need to be purchased.

Nativity Scene:

- The nativity scene will be put out during the same week that the Christmas trees are put up.

Donations:

- A notice will be placed in the bulletin for those interested in making a

Christmas donation.

Miscellaneous:

- Potluck on December 21st:
- Gayle will place a notice in the bulletin requesting volunteers to set up and clean up. She will also post a sign-up sheet for the potluck.
