From the Pastor's Desk - Why Easter Matters

A NOTE FROM PASTOR SCOTT REGARDING LIVING WITH EPILEPSY AND SEIZURE IDENTIFICATION

It is odd for anyone to share their health issues in a church newsletter. However, after a recent experience in a council meeting, and now being three years since last educating the people of Zion, about the epilepsy I suffer from, it is time. I am also not the only one who has epilepsy in the congregation.

There are several different types of seizures.

Generalized onset seizures (most familiar):

During these seizures motor skills are impaired. A person may experience sustained rhythmical jerking movements, muscles can become weak, or tense and rigid, perhaps muscles twitch and epileptic spasms occur (body flexes and extends repeatedly). Usually, people fall to the floor. I have had these types of seizures before and am susceptible to them, but my anti-epileptic medication controls them.

<u>Focal onset impaired awareness (hard to identify):</u> When a person is confused or their awareness is affected in some way during a focal seizure, it's called a focal impaired awareness seizure.

The <u>non-motor symptoms of focal onset impaired awareness seizures</u> affect thinking or cognition. These seizures could appear as changes in sensation, emotions, or lack of movement called behavior arrest. This means that movement stops – the person may just stare and not make any other movements.

My seizure activity and how to deal with it

When I have a seizure usually it reveals itself as a focal onset impaired seizure. I can look like I am functioning normally, carry on conversations, walk, and remain active. The conversation probably is confusing because I don't understand anything that is coming out of my mouth. I am disoriented and probably unaware of my surroundings. I may show signs of anxiety. The odd time I simply do not respond to conversations.

Recently in a council meeting I was asked a question, proceeded to fumble with an answer which should have been simple. I eventually got back to the originally question. I kind of answered it. No one was aware that I had a seizure. Another time, at a different meeting out of the blue I said, "I need some air" and went outside. This was a seizure. If something like this happens someone go with me.

Unfortunately, I deal with these seizures on a more regular basis in the past six months. I am now connected to a new neurologist which is a good thing.

I need you: if you think that I may be having a seizure simply ask me if I am okay. Ask more than once. You will not offend me. In fact, I always have some anxiety after a seizure. The seizures last 3-5 minutes.

If by chance I happen to have a seizure and fall to the ground do the following: move things out of the way. Find something soft to protect my head (pillow, sweater, anything soft). Roll me on my side if possible. DO NOT stick anything in my mouth. If more than one seizure occurs call an ambulance otherwise just let me rest. I will be extremely tired. Then call Pastor Sue.

It is wonderful to belong to such a loving parish at Zion. I trust that if anything were to happen I would be cared for. Thank you in advance.

NEWS FROM THE ORGAN RESTORATION COMMITTEE

By the time that you receive this copy of the Guiding Light you will notice that our organ is now silent. Casavant workers have been at the church on Tuesday and Wednesday this past week to remove all the pipes to take to their shop for the releathering process of 2800 pipes. This will be a five-month project so the next time that we will hear our beautiful organ played will be late summer or early fall. In that five-month window we need to raise \$15,400.27 to be able to pay Casavant in full on completion of their work. you will be able to see the progression towards this goal on the wall leading into the parish hall on the sheet of music bars. There are fifteen bars, each representing \$1000.00. For every \$1000.00 increment, a bar will be filled in with pipes. Also, donor's names will be included under the bars.

Also, on Friday, May 24th we are planning to hold a dance(non-alcoholic) in the parish hall from 8:00 to 11:00 P. M. with a local band called Ryan Ziggs and the Zags. They play mainly old rock and roll with some country. There will also be a surprise musician playing when the band takes their breaks so it will be non-stop music for three hours. The cost for the dance will be \$15.00 with tickets being available in early May from any member of the committee (Kathy Nieman, Wilmer Verch, Cheryl Sack, Blaine Sack or Gayle Seegmiller). Tickets will also be available at the door. Invite your friends and come out for a fun evening.

We appreciate all donations to this cause but please make sure that you are meeting the needs of the church at large first.

Following is a description of the extensive repairs that will be done. Remember, also, that this is the final phase of the organ restoration. Following is a description of what this entails.

Update on the Organ Restoration

Each pipe in the organ has a small leather pouch under it, which can vary in size between that of a quarter and a loonie! Each pouch controls the air to the one pipe. The releathering of pipe valve actions and pressure regulating bellows, like that of an accordion, are necessary in the long term. Generally, after 50 years these leather pouches and other leather parts can start to fail, and Zion's organ turned 50 years old in 2019. So far the organ has been holding together well, but Casavant's technicians have noticed over the last year some of the leather is starting to harden and become wrinkled. Zion's organ has over 2100 pipes, meaning that over 2100 of these small, thin leather pouches have to be replaced, and most times these leather pouches are punched and formed by hand, not by a machine! Presently Casavant, the builder of Zion's organ, has releathered most of their organs installed from 1963 to 1965, and are working their way up the years. Once restored Zion's organ will be given another 50 plus years of new life!

The rate of leather deterioration is dependent upon air pollutants and tanning procedures, or quality of the leather used by the organ builder. Over time combination actions and switching systems can become unreliable, due to 'leaks' from cracks in the leather, allowing air to escape and compromising the supposed 'enclosed' wind system. Climate changes, in and outside of the church, can also affect the different materials and metal used in pipe making, along with compromising the leather, high quality canvas, rubber cloth and wood, used to construct the wind chests or 'lungs' of the organ, and other internal components of the instrument.

Work on this final phase of the organ's restoration will commence in the spring of 2024. Removal of all parts on site start after Easter of next year, which is March 31; therefore, dismantling of the organ could happen as early as April 2, 2024. The organ will be out of commission and not playable for several months, post Easter and into Pentecost. The releathering process could take up to 3 months in the Builder's workshops. The reinstallation of all removed parts would happen in August of next year, followed by an extensive tuning. Payments to the Builder, being Casavant Freres, are required upon: (1) signing of the contract or 'memo of agreement', which happened on November 30th, 2023; (2) dismantling of the organ and removal of all parts from the church; (3) when all parts have been repaired, worked on and are ready for shipment from the Builder's workshops back to Zion; and (4) after the re-installation and a full tuning are completed.


