



A GUIDE TO WEARING MASKS AT ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH

March 21 signified the beginning phases of re-opening the province of Ontario. You will no longer be required to wear masks in the church. We ask you to please consider wearing masks in densely populated areas of the church for the protection of yourself and others. Sunday mornings and other worship services are suggested dates. The worship leaders will continue to wear masks as they have close contact with people at Holy Communion.

The Social Ministry Committee has some funds in our Good Shepherding Fund that we have earmarked to assist families by helping to send their kids to Camp Lutherlyn. If you have a child or children who would like to attend Camp Lutherlyn please speak to Pastor Sue or Ellen Vandersleen. The Social Ministry of Zion would love to assist. Depending on the response will determine how much we can assist.

ORGAN RESTORATION

In 2017 after the first phase of our organ restoration was completed, Casavant recommended that the second phase of the restoration which involves replacing the "leathers" in all the pipes should be completed in 5 years, which brings us to 2022. The estimated cost for this work has gone up substantially from the initial estimate of approximately \$45,000.00 to \$65,000.00. Since we only have \$35,809.00 in the organ restoration fund, we do not have the funds to complete the required work this year. As a result, Casavant was contacted to see if this second phase could be put off for a year or two. Their response was this: "At this point in time the organ is working well with the leathers not appearing to be a concern, so we could potentially push this phase back two years. Bear in mind, folks, that in two year's time, the cost will also be higher. Right now the organ valuation is \$1,200,000.00." The Worship & Music Committee will keep you updated re - the growth in the organ restoration fund.



PULSE MINISTRY

A new ministry has started up again. The family and youth ministry. It also has a new name: **PULSE MINISTRY**

PULSE MINISTRY will have three different entities which will be called by their names and every

generation is invited to worship and to Messy Church: Messy Church, Youth Group, and worship. The worship Service will be called "Living Stones".
