From the Pastor's Desk

Birds, Birthdays, Baptisms and God

These are two lovely activities you can try over summer to help your child or grandchild begin to think about God's Holy Spirit - the part of God that lives in our hearts today, filling us with God's power and love.

1. Happy Birthdays

Are you going to a birthday party this summer? Think about why birthdays are happy events and how we celebrate them.

When you go to a birthday party, you can think about how we celebrate the beginning of each life with joy, by singing, eating together, and playing games. Birthdays are a nice time to pray too - you can say thank you to God for starting the new life of the birthday boy or girl.

There is a time of year when the church celebrates its 'birthday' too. It is called Pentecost and falls fifty days after Easter Sunday. This year Pentecost Sunday is May 19th.

Churches celebrate this day because after Jesus rose from the dead, he spent forty days with his friends, and then he went up to heaven. Before he went, he promised to send God's spirit to live in people's hearts and help them live as followers of Jesus.





- 2. Approval of Agenda: The agenda was moved by Jamie and second by Brent.

3. Approval of Minutes:

• The council meeting minutes of March were reviewed previously via email. Minutes from the last meeting moved by Denise, second by Justine.

4. Finance Report:

• The financial report as of April 03, 2024, shows a Total expense of \$90,081.92 and a net income of (-18,978.43).

6. Correspondence:

- Society of St. Vincent du Paul interested in donations. Denise will take this to the Social Committee.
- The Grind coldest night of the year raised \$120 000.00. They asked if we would let them use our parking lot and hall for their annual coldest night of the year barbeque and next year's night of fundraising on Saturday Feb 22. This too was passed on to the social committee.

7. Committee Reports:

Property Committee

• The Christian school using the classrooms every Friday was discussed. Questions: why are they moving, insurance, costs to us including custodial, how to price this, funerals on Friday would not be available? It would be a revenue stream, but we should look to update our hall and facility rental guidelines and fees.

- Emergency access signage will be installed by the city as soon as the frost is out. It will be on the Miller St. entrance.
- Old piano in the basement will be removed soon.
- The pews in the gallery attic have been measured and counted by Kevin and are ready to be sold.
- Flagpole? The cost would be \$200 \$300 plus labour, concrete and the flag. This has been tabled for future consideration.
- Elevator entrance walkway replacement. Quotes and ideas are being looked into.
- Hydro. Another 5-year contract has been signed with Ontario wholesale Energy. Time use id not a factor and it does save us money. Ottawa river Power still provides the service, and they bill us.
- The parking lots will be cleared of sand as soon as weather permits.

Worship and Music – organ has been taken apart.

Social Ministry Committee- Meals for senior shut-ins.

PULSE Ministries – Messy Church continues to be a success. Next Messy Church will be May 6. The group is planning a Messy Church Sunday on May 5.

8. New Business:

• After a review of the Personnel Committee's terms of reference in Zion's Policies and Procedures manual council determined that some revisions were required. A motion was put forward to accept the changes to the Personnel Committee's purpose in Zion's Policies and Procedures Manual. The reason for the changes was to clearly articulate who evaluates the staff and who evaluates the pastor. The Personnel Committee does evaluation for all staff of the church with exception of the pastor. The Mutual Ministry Team is responsible for constant evaluation and discussion of the pastor throughout the year. Other changes were made to the Personnel Committee's roles that included for example the removal of their duty to provide human resources materials.

The entire motion at Zion Church Council Meeting, April 09, 2024

Motion to confirm the Terms of Reference and the Scope of Responsibilities for the Personnel Committee, and to distinguish these responsibilities from those of the Mutual Ministry Team.

Both the Mutual Ministry Team and the Personnel Committee serve valuable but different purposes to the overall mission of Zion Lutheran Church. While it may appear that certain responsibilities overlap, the role of the Mutual Ministry Team is somewhat more complex as it involves the broader church ministry. This motion is intended to clearly differentiate between the two groups.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

- The Personnel Committee provides leadership and oversight support to the non-Clergy staff of Zion Lutheran Church¹
- The Personnel Committee strives to ensure that the staff is provided with the necessary conditions to fulfill their mission and ministry.
- Acts as a liaison between staff, council and the congregation.
- Maintains current and updated job descriptions.
- Recommends a compensation package to the Finance Committee and Church Council annually.

- Mediates conflict and/or problems between staff, council and the congregation.
- Promotes and encourages professional development growth.

MUTUAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE (MMC)

- The pastor(s) will work with the Mutual Ministry Committee.
- To work with the congregational council/board to ensure clear and realistic expectations are developed for council/board members, rostered ministers, and congregational ministries.
- To support effective communication among the congregation, and rostered ministers.
- To act as a confidential sounding board and support team for rostered ministers.
- To evaluate the pastor using the five-step process included in the ELCIC mutual ministry guide.
- To review and provide timely compensation recommendations to the congregational council/board for rostered ministers. (Referring to the Eastern Synod Compensation Guidelines for Rostered Ministers)
- To work towards conflict resolution as it arises.

The motion to accept the proposed changes was moved by Jamie, seconded by Brent and passed unanimously.

• Blaine Sack: Church Musician

- The grand piano in the sanctuary is holding well since its follow-up tuning in February. It will be well used over the next 5 months, with the organ being out of service. The next tuning will be scheduled for the end of August or early September.
- During the restoration process, the organ will remain 'out of service.'
- Choirs continue to practice on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. A few past members have returned to the Men's choir and a new young singer has joined the Mixed choir.
- Both choirs sang at each of the special services during Holy week. They also sang during the Wednesday evening services during Lent and the Palm Sunday service.
- Upcoming hymn sings are scheduled for April 28th and June 30th.
- The Mixed choir, along with Sherri Phannenhour as soloist, lead the singing of Psalm 4 on April 14th. This was well received by the congregation. The hope is to continue this practice as a 'treat' and special musical offering every 4 6 weeks. The next sung Psalm will be shared on May 19th, which is Pentecost Sunday.

- The next blended service will be on Pentecost Sunday. Music will be chosen, practiced, prepared and performed by Blaine and the Living Stones Band.
- Blaine will reach out to a few guest soloists, singers and instrumental groups to inquire about sharing their musical talents with us during the summer months.
