From the Pastor's Desk

The Joy of Lent

Have you ever thought about the joy in sacrifice that Lent provides? Most of us don't delight in sacrifice; in fact, in our daily lives, we often do our best to avoid challenges and practices that push us outside of our comfort zones. In Christianity, there is a beautiful irony between joy and sacrifice, and we are presented with a wonderful opportunity to embrace this uniquely during Lent. In one of his Lenten messages, Pope Francis shared, "Lent is a fitting time for selfdenial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty."

While giving up sweets in favor of healthy snacks for Lent is a common and noble endeavor, the goal of Lent should not only be a spiritual excuse to lose weight! In choosing acts of self-denial, we are saying "no" to things in order to get into the practice of saying "no" when inclined towards sin, ultimately deepening our faith and our relationship with the Lord.

Victory can be found when we deny ourselves and pick up our crosses and hardships in order to grow closer to Christ!

Therein lies the joy. When we grow closer to God by denying our will, we say "yes" to a life of abundance with Him. Our God is a benevolent God; He will not hold back His grace from those who honor Him and choose challenging things to grow and give Him glory. Christ even tells us Himself, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Without question, Lent is a time for conscious penitence and spiritual preparation for Easter. And it is important to remember that God loves us whether we make Lenten changes or not. At the same time, Lent provides us an opportunity to make God a greater part of our life, and to take our faith to new levels. Stewardship is a God-centered way of life — a spiritual way of living that, above all, acknowledges God's presence in all we do.

Lent is a time for every one of us to do more than simply deny ourselves; we need to welcome God into our lives in greater ways so that when we get to Holy Week and Easter, we have an even greater

appreciation for the sacrifice the Lord made for us. Talk about pure joy!

May you and your loved ones enjoy a holy and joyous Lenten journey.

More about Evangelism

Jesus said:

"Go, and MAKE DISCIPLES of all nations, BAPTIZING them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, TEACHING them to observe all things that I commanded you."

We call that the Great Commission. It's the mission of the church to go – to make disciples – to baptize – and to teach people to obey Jesus. The Great Commission has four imperatives:

(1) Go.

(2) Make disciples.

(3) Baptize.

(4) Teach – specifically, teach people to obey Jesus' commandments.

That isn't just the CHURCH'S job – it's my job – and it's YOUR job too! Each of us has a different set of friends and neighbors and co-workers – and Jesus calls each of us to go – to make disciples – to baptize – and to teach.

You might be thinking, "Well, that might work somewhere, but it won't work here." But it can work here. Churches that emphasize inviting your friends to church grow – and churches that don't emphasize those things shrink. It's that simple.

These days Christians tend to be skittish about this sort of thing. The reason we're skittish about evangelism is that we think of evangelism, as I just shared, as door-to-door calling and hard selling. Most of us have had people knock on our door or call us on the phone to sell us something – whether the something is magazines or Jesus – and we don't like it. We don't like to be on either end of a hard sell. We don't want to be the person DOING the calling and we don't want to be the person BEING CALLED.

But Jesus didn't tell us to do cold calling. He didn't tell us to do hard selling. He said, to be exact: love God, love others.

If you're happy in your church, then please invite others to join you. It's not rocket science. It's simple. We don't have to make this harder than it is.

Enjoy this time of evangelism and invitation... who knows you just might be the difference in someone's new or ongoing relationship with God!



A Message from the Mutual Ministry Committee

A Message from the Mutual Ministry Committee

The Mutual Ministry Committee met on February 15 to begin a Ministry Review with Pastor Scott. We are following the five-step process outlined in the Ministry Review guide from the Eastern Synod. Once the process is complete, a report will be made back to council as appropriate.

However, we began our meeting discussing a matter of concern regarding an anonymous letter received by Pastor Scott. In discussion with Pastor Scott, this is not the first type of such communication he has received; the handwriting is similar amongst the various notes and letters. Pastor Sue has indicated that she also has received such communications at times.

The matter is very concerning due to the nature of the comments and the language used. The pages of the Pastor's Report were torn out of the Annual Report and certain phrases were underlined and comments made either beside or below the phrases.

While not all comments will be referenced, the Mutual Ministry Team feels it is important to share some of them to give the congregation further context.

Here are a few examples:

- (Pastor's report, page 4) "Some things have become simpler, yet others more complex. But through it all, we've continued to wrestle. And that's a good thing." Comment- *no sick of it and you.*
- (Pastor's report, page 5) "I am very proud of how the people of Zion have become such a hospitable and caring congregation." Comment- *but not our ministers*.
- Comments (written on the bottom of the Pastor's report, page 5) You think your the Boss but members of Zion are the Boss we pay you both your salary- so sit down and listen...

That a member of our congregation would feel it is appropriate to disrespect one of our Pastors in this manner is disappointing to say the least. This type of behaviour is considered not only inappropriate but unkind.

Our Church's Constitution outlines the various steps in the process of reconciliation and discipline of a member, when the member has engaged in conduct that is unbecoming a member of the body of Christ. Please be aware that this matter has been brought to Congregational Council and is being addressed in due process.

Anyone who has questions, or issues, regarding the Pastor(s) can approach any member of the Mutual Ministry Committee, in confidence, or a member of church council. Writing anonymous letters to critique the Pastor is not the way to address issues.

We are one body with the purpose of doing Ministry together.
