The new model constitution will enable smoother changes to occur. Council is required to vote on changes to the model constitution as the first step in the process. However, due to low attendance at the council meeting, the vote will happen via email. After approval by council, the next step is bringing the suggested changes to the membership of Zion via a congregational meeting, which will likely be held this fall.

8. New Business

- Mission grants- Synod has money available every year. This year the grants are available in the spring to be used during the year. Pastor Scott has applied for grants for both Messy Church and the Living Stones Worship (combined total of \$2200.00).
- June 4- Building community workshop. The Ottawa Valley Ministry Area Team, which includes Renfrew County Lutheran churches, will be meeting in the Parish Hall on June 4. Representatives from the area's Lutheran churches will be in attendance and will discuss various topics including technology, looking to the future, socializing, and volunteering.
- Universal Portrait Studios-positive comments were made about the seamless process for arranging the photos for the church directory via Universal Portrait Studios.
- Staying Connected Program-members on the Care List have been contacted regarding interest in the Staying Connected Program. There was limited interest in the program due to a variety of reasons. The next round of calls will be made to other older members of the congregation who may benefit from this program.

The Staying Connected Program



You may have read about the Staying Connected Program earlier this year in the Guiding Light as part of the March Council Meeting minutes. We are happy to announce that the funding for this program was approved and has been provided by The Government of Canada's New Horizons for Seniors Program!

The Staying Connected Program is a pilot project of the Social Ministry Group and it is aimed at supporting Zion's older adult members become familiar with the use of digital technology.

The funding received through the New Horizons for Seniors Program is being put towards the purchase of a number of iPads and iPad protective cases. We are awaiting the delivery of the iPads and hope to start some of the training and education over the summer. At present the majority of iPads have been assigned, however, if anyone is interested in this program, please contact Ellen Vandersleen or Karen Gauthier.

As part of this program, we are providing training (either one on one or in a group format) over the next several months in the set up and use of a loaned iPad. Training and education will include teaching on how to use the iPad, how to set up and use email and how to navigate the web safely. Training and support will continue throughout the length of the program, which runs until March 27, 2023.

We are blessed to be able to provide this program to Zion's older members...being able to connect with the church online through the church website, to access on-line worship services, and to connect with family and friends on-line are all good things to know and can help people stay, and feel, more connected!

Thank you so much for anyone helping with donating things for the food bank.

I would like to ask for some help if you have any of these things:

- 1) Plastic bags from the grocery store
- 2) Plastic outside milk bags
- 3) Any type of plastic bottle except water bottles as they are too flimsy. Ensure bottles, small juice bottles, Gatorade bottles or small juice bottles or vitamin bottles are all used. We use these bottles to give out laundry detergent, dish detergent, shampoo etc. We need about 100 bottles per week. We usually can only hand out a portion of the ones needed as I do not get enough.
- 4) Plastic bags that the papers (blue) come in or small plastic bags you get with fruits and vegetables. I use these to put their detergents in so in case of spillage the liquid does not get on their regular groceries.

If anyone can help me with any of these things please bring to church and put in the food bank box at the top of the stairs. Our food bank is so busy now as things get harder for a lot of people so thank you for anything you can contribute. - Debbie Sitkiewicz
