Lighting of the Fourth Candle

First Reader: Today, we come face to face with the scandal of Advent: Mary, the unmarried mother; God Incarnate growing in Mary's womb as a vulnerable baby; Joseph contemplating leaving Mary because of her pregnancy; God's love at work in ways that society and propriety could not understand; God calling Mary and Joseph to faithfulness despite the fear of disgrace.

All: With Mary and Joseph, we choose to wait, watch, and listen for the way of Love instead of responding in fear to the world's judgment.

First Reader: We light this candle of love as a sign of our faithfulness as we seek, find, and follow Emmanuel, God with us.

Light the fourth candle of the Advent wreath.

Narrator 1:

Welcome everyone to Bethlehem! Let us open our eyes and ears and listen to the story of when Christ was born.

Part I: Mary and Joseph

Have you ever wanted to play Mary or Joseph. This is your chance. Come forward and help us tell the story.

Those who wish to portray Mary and Joseph are invited forward. Marys are given a shawl or scarf; Josephs are given a bathrobe

Song: ELW 293 That Boy: Child of Mary.

Refrain

That boy-child of Mary was born in a stable, a manger his cradle in Bethlehem.

1 What shall we call him, child of the manger? What name is given in Bethlehem? **Refrain**

2 His name is Jesus, God ever with us, God given for us in Bethlehem. **Refrain**

3 How can he save us, how can he help us, born here among us in Bethlehem? **Refrain**

4 Gift of the Father, to human mother, makes him our brother in Bethlehem. **Refrain**

5 One with the Father, he is our Savior, heaven-sent helper in Bethlehem. **Refrain**

6 Gladly we praise him, love and adore him, give ourselves to him in Bethlehem. **Refrain**

When the Marys and Josephs are on stage, narrator begins.

Narrator 1:

There'll not be a room in all Bethlehem," I said. But their eyes told a story of hunger and need. I couldn't avoid them, so I tried a good deed. I cleaned up the stable: Rachel cooked up a meal. We helped all we could, at least, that's how I feel. For we noticed that Mary was expecting – and soon! So we prepared for delivery right under the moon. The child came so quickly. His face seemed a light. As if God had shone God's presence so bright. Joseph said softly. "It's Jesus, my friend." God sent him among us to bring to an end fear and hatred, darkness and sin. Instead God gave light, to let God's love in.

Part II: The Animals

There were many animals who were the stable that night. Please come forward to be one of the goats, sheep, cows, and watch the birth of Jesus with awe.

Those who wish to be goats, sheep, cows or donkeys are invited by narrator to come forward. Animals are given masks or hats.

"The Friendly Beasts." When the animals are on stage, narrator begins.

1 Jesus, our brother, strong and good, was humbly born in a stable rude, and the friendly beasts around Him stood, Jesus, our brother, strong and good.

2 "I," said the donkey, shaggy and brown, "I carried His mother uphill and down, I carried His mother to Bethlehem town; I," said the donkey, shaggy and brown.

3 "I," said the cow, all white and red, "I gave Him my manger for his bed, I gave Him hay to pillow His head; I," said the cow, all white and red.

4 "I," said the sheep with curly horn, "I gave Him my wool for His blanket warm, He wore my coat on Christmas morn; I," said the sheep with curly horn.

5 "I," said the dove, from the rafters high, "I cooed Him to sleep that he should not cry, we cooed Him to sleep, my mate and I; I," said the dove, from the rafters high.

6 Thus all the beasts, by some good spell, in the stable dark were glad to tell of the gifts they gave Emmanuel, the gifts they gave Emmanuel.

Narrator:

The animals were calm, quieter than normal.

Part III: Angels

If you want to be an angel or perhaps you already are come forward to tell the story to the shepherds. *Those who wish to be angels are invited forward. Gold and silver garland halos are placed on their heads.*

Narrator:

Part IV: Shepherd

If you want to be a shepherd on this holy day Come forward and receive your staff. Those who wish to be shepherds are invited forward. They are given candy canes to represent shepherd's staffs.

When the shepherds are on stage, narrator begins.

Refrain

Narrator:
