From the Pastor's Pen (cont'd)

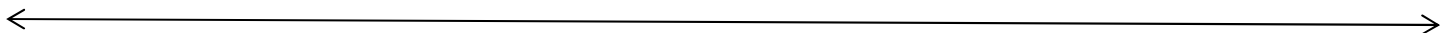

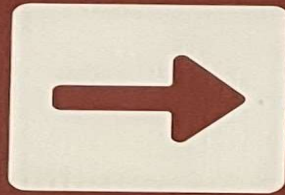
