#### **Committee Reports:**

#### **Property:**

The state of the Parish Hall floor was discussed. We are looking into what can be done to restore it. We have been told before that it cannot be sanded down any more. Looking into a deep clean and re-coating.

It was brought to my attention that the fire door in the corridor between the parish hall and the church sanctuary was slamming. Wilmer has repaired it.

We discussed installing a draft stop door in the west basement exit before next winter. There is used material there to construct the wall. Kevin may have a suitable used door.

The light at the entrance from the parking lot to the elevator needs to be repaired.

The kitchen taps and sink drain were repaired/replaced in the rental house. The dryer has been vented to the exterior and a proper drain was installed for the washing machine in the basement. The leaking laundry tub will be replaced soon. The contractor has been given the permission to proceed with the re-roofing as weather conditions are suitable.

Severe spalling has been observed on the main entrance concrete staircase walls. Quotes and recommendations are required for this work.

The ceiling fans in the sanctuary are very dirty. They will be cleaned soon.

The light fixture on the west stairs to the balcony was dead and has been replaced.

Blaine has requested a humidifier for the organ wind chest to preserve the organ during the heating season. Blaine has given us guidelines from the organ tuner and Don has investigated humidifiers. Don has ordered a suitable unit and I will assist him with the installation.

Kevin has arranged winter sand cleanup.

Concern has been expressed about the tree branches over the reserved parking area. Dead branches will be removed once the trees have leaves and the dead branches can be more easily identified.

There are two cracks in an east facing stained glass window. Wilmer is enquiring as to what has to be done to protect it from failure.

The Property committee got quotes last year to repair/replace the ramp to the east side entrance. The ramp alone was just over \$16,000 plus \$7,000 for paving to match the new ramp. Assistance and guidance is needed from Church Council as to what is to be done with this. Fund raising?

- 7. **Social Ministry**: The yard sale was a success and we will have the final total later. Half the proceeds will go to the food bank and the other half to our general fund.
- 8. **Cemetery Board:** Met at the cemetery to take a look and see what needs to be done Make it look beautiful. They will report on that later.
- 9. **Web Page:** Justine made some changes and we are going to try them out for awhile ourselves before hiring a web designer.

#### 10. New Business:

**Wedding Policy:** Council discussed the Marriage policy in general and in particular the wording of the Organist contract regarding the section pertaining to fees for playing music. Council has provided a guideline of the changes to the contract it believes are necessary to the Personnel Committee. Council has requested the committee meet with Blaine to discuss and make the amendment to the contract.
