## MELT THE MOUNTAINS...

*'The Mountains melted like wax at the presence of the LORD,' Ps 97:5*

Psalm 97 contains the key to understanding the Image of God and how we who are made in His image can reach forth, transcend this world into the Kingdom of God, and experience the sheer power of the LORD. As we read this Psalm and absorb the Word deep within us and meditate upon it, we in turn allow Him to reveal His purpose for us.

The Psalm opens with the Kingship of our Lord God who is the creator of all things. Once you get your head 'around' that concept of what Kingship means, you are in a better position to start reading the first verse. Positioning yourself to read the Word is so important, alignment with Jesus His Son and others within the kingdom is so important.

Verse 1 this tell us as that the LORD reigns – that means that His decisions are supreme, that He and He alone has dominion and power over all things; not governments, or leaderships but the LORD our God and creator, who has the ultimate supreme power to reign over all things. A King or Queen can only 'reign' after a victory has been won and they are unchallenged – think of the cross.

Because our LORD reigns, we are told that earth ought to rejoice and be glad. As this world's condition deteriorates and heaves back and forth with grief at man's actions, this verse tells us that the earth trembles at the LORD's presence and

that the very mountains melt like wax! The earth itself responds to the LORD's presence – we need only be glad! (Verse 12).

Our Creator's throne is not comprised as an earthly one and doesn't look anything like a monarch's throne that many visualise in their finite minds - righteousness and justice are the foundations of this throne – and the throne itself? It is one comprising grace, one that we can all approach with confidence...

***'Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.'*** Heb 4:16

Therefore, the spiritual concepts of His kingdom though sometimes difficult for us to understand usually require help – our helper is the Holy Spirit who can help us to reach or achieve this conceptual understanding, through His gifts, enabling a greater understanding of these spiritual principalities, powers and dominions. To open another door to that which is unseen we are told are the things to seek – helping us to attain an eternal state whilst still on earth...

***'So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.'*** 2 Cor 4:18

As we continue to read this amazing Psalm the true nature of the power of God is exposed and we begin to realise that Jesus, our savior who sits at the right hand of the power of God is our only way into His presence. He is not only our savior and we bear His mark but He is our intercessor; only He and He alone can make intercession for us to Father God – our Creator. It is then as you begin to soak into your being the supernatural nature of God and that He has enabled us to have access to Him through His Son Jesus who rent the veil in two, that we begin to gain a sense of the greatness of the Father who not only preserves our souls but embellishes our spirits through the truth and the living Word.

***'...Who preserves the souls of His godly ones...'*** Psalm 97:10

In addition, as our Heavenly Father you are also reassured that He and He alone is protecting you:-

**"Do not touch My anointed ones, And do My prophets no harm."** 1 Chron 16:22

Whenever I read this Psalm my spirit is so uplifted I burst out in praise and uplift His Holy name, immediately the mountains in our lives begin to melt away and the only person left on His feet is Jesus, standing at the cross...what are the idols in your life? Do they have this power? In Psalm 97:1 the earth is told to rejoice – this is us, this is our part - the rest of the Psalm is about Him...Rejoice!

## Messianic Moment

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### **The Hebraic Heart of Leadership**

#### **Part 2**

Throughout church history, and today, we see leaders who have been compromised, to one degree or another, so that they were (or are) deceived into building their own religious empires. The subtlety of the deception is great, but the fruit is always the same, people are not given the spiritual environment they need to grow in their relationship with God and to fulfil their calling. They are trapped in a religious system that keeps them spiritually weak and dependent upon their so-called "leaders." These leaders' words and deeds reveal the fact that they do not have a Hebraic heart but a heart that seeks things other than the glory of the King and the spiritual maturity of His people. These leaders are locked into protecting and promoting their religious system because it gives them a degree of security and power. For others to grow spiritually is very threatening and resisted by various means.

Leaders in the Kingdom of God, however, are people who have been, and continue to be, impacted by the power of the Holy Spirit. The result of that encounter is a heart that seeks only the Glory of the King and the spiritual growth of those in his Kingdom. This kind of heart is exemplified and modelled for us by the Apostle Paul. The motivation of his heart is clearly seen in Colossians 1:28, where he wrote that he was doing everything he could to present every person complete in the Messiah. To present every person complete in the Messiah is the goal of everyone who is a true leader in the Kingdom of God. If you are a leader, or aspire to be a leader in the Kingdom of God, and you have any other incentive or goal, you must carefully and rigorously examine the motives of your heart. Please understand that the deceptions that lead someone to build the "empire of self" instead of the Kingdom of God are extremely subtle. We are all so very easily influenced by the power and needs of "self." Diligent self-examination, open-faced humble prayer (i.e. prayer that entreats God to test you and reveal your own motives) and trusted Godly relationships are a few of the weapons we can use to keep the motivations of our hearts pure.

When his disciples came to Him asking about greatness, the Messiah explained to them one of the fundamental principles of leadership in His Kingdom. He said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves benefactors. But you are not to be like that. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the

youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves" (Luke 22:25-26). This theme is repeated in Matthew 20:24-28 when He said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave--just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

This is the fundamental motivation of the heart of a leader that is revealed in our Hebraic religion. It is a heart that is motivated to serve. It is a heart that only wants to see the King glorified and to see His people come into the completeness that He desires. It is a heart that is ready, willing, and able to give its life for the purposes of God to be established in others. It does not think about itself first, it thinks about the King and His aspirations for His people. Its only motivation is to be pleasing to the Lord and to see Him glorified. It does not care what others may say or do. It only cares about being faithful to the King and doing what He desires in the lives of His children. It is always focused on the will of God, not the desires of men. Such a leader is willing to risk the rejection of people in order to accomplish the purposes of God. Leaders with a Hebraic heart are willing to suffer personal rejection because they will not acquiesce to anyone's agenda. They firmly resist being compromised by anyone or anything. They will not commit spiritual treason by usurping or misusing the delegated authority that they received from the King. They will use that authority for building up the Body of Christ and not for building their own religious empires. Do not be deceived, people with corrupt motivations can still exercise spiritual authority. "The gifts and callings of God are without repentance" (Romans 11:29). This is why Jesus told us that on the day of Judgment many will come to him declaring what they have done and He will order them to depart (Matthew 7:21-23).

God's servants are not slaves, at the beck and call of other people's selfish, self-centered demands. They seek only to serve the purposes of God in other people's lives. They seek to disciple and equip the saints so that they can fulfil God's will in their lives. Discipling and equipping others can sometimes call for uncomfortable confrontations and sombre exhortations to repentance and godly living. Not only do leaders need the right motivation for serving, they need the right strategies to implement the purposes of God. Discipling others is not easy. It requires much wisdom and spiritual maturity. These qualities are not obtained easily or cheaply. It is precisely because these qualities are purchased with great personal expense that we see so little of it. But God is raising up a new generation of leaders, a generation of leaders with a Hebraic heart, a heart to see the people of God become all that He desires.



# IN FOCUS

## PATRICIA BOOTSMA – Part 1

Patricia Bootsma alongside her husband John are the Senior Pastors of Jubilee Christian Fellowship in Stratford, ON, Canada, a Partners in Harvest church closely linked with its daughter church, Toronto Airport Christian Fellowship. John and Patricia founded and pastored TACF's Prophetic Team. Patricia travels locally and abroad inspiring hearts to know the Father's love, awaken with passion for Jesus and walk intimately with the Holy Spirit.

Additionally she helps to equip the Bride of Christ to hear the voice of the Bridegroom, operate proficiently in the prophetic gifting with accompanying signs and wonders walking in both the Great Commandment and the Great Commission. John and Patricia host an annual International School of the Prophets, with a one-week version now spreading into various International locations. John and Patricia are the parents of six fabulous children.

In 2010, 3-in-1 Publishing had the opportunity to interview Patricia in an amazing interview Part 1 is here today with Part 2 to follow later...

**Q Ok Patricia so how long have you been in the ministry full-time?**

**A** I have been in the ministry since 1995 fulltime

**Q What led you to the Lord?**

**A** I was 12 years old when I became born again. I was raised in a church, like a traditional church and I was attending a Christian church school, one day the teacher explained that you must be born-again. So I cried unto the Lord and became born-again. However, it was at age 8 I had had an incredible encounter with what I

believe were two angels. I remember that they came to my family farm and they told me about my life that I would travel and go to the nations and that I would tell people about Jesus, and that I would see people come to salvation. It was obviously a prophetic word but at the time I was only 8 years old and I wasn't born again then but I just thought wow these people know about my life how incredible! My mom who was working nearby so I asked her later did she see these people and did she know who they were? She said 'what people?' I said 'well those people' but they were gone. I can't prove it but I do believe that they were angels. So my heart was branded then and from then I always had a desire for the Lord but I became born-again at aged 12.

**Q So then when you became born again at age 12 did that memory come back and did you have a desire then to go to the nations?**

**A** You know it really didn't leave me, from the age of 8 actually, I would have visions also of people coming to Jesus, however there was one vision that was very distinct that would occur again and again, like when I was 8, 10, 14 and so on - I was at an open air meeting on stage preaching to other people and with others. I wasn't the only preacher on the stage but we would kinda take turns. I would see all these different faces and I thought it was Africa. It's interesting because Nov 2007 was my first time that I would go to Africa and I had a 'mini version' of that vision coming true! Because I was speaking in an open air meeting in the back of a truck with all these generators and microphones and there was all these people from all the villages and surrounding villages had come out, and a man I had just prayed for he had been paralysed for 18 months, here was this man blind, deaf and paralysed and it was incredible because he got healed! His blindness left, we led him to Jesus his hearing was restored and because of his miraculous healing the whole village gave their lives to Jesus!

**Q So how does that make you feel as a human being to witness this and that God has used you in this way?**

**A** I really believe that when God's Word is spoken and this is really important that it is important to know what is God or what is 'me the flesh'. But from the age of eight, I have really believed in the power of God's spoken Word, in the power of Jesus. The power to direct

us, the power to enable us to have relationship with the Lord and what is so important for me is being able to have that intimacy and relating to God as my Father and Jesus as the bridegroom and the having the Holy Spirit as my constant

companion and source of power. So it definitely changes the way I live my life, because I believe in miracles and I believe God speaks to enable us to perpetually hear when I need a prophetic word for somebody. This is the big thing that I want to impress on the body of Christ is that we can lead prophetic lives, that we can live a lifestyle. For instance, we hear God for us, we hear God for our children or we hear God in evangelism like we hear God for just anything. You know we need to hear Him, Jesus said that man would not live by bread alone but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. Yes, it definitely has changed me to see prophecy fulfilled.


**Q    Intercession is a big feature in your ministry, would you say intercession not only keeps you in 'tune' with God but more importantly in alignment with His purposes for your ministry?**

Absolutely I feel very strongly that intercession and the prophetic go together. The Lord has really revealed to me the importance of intercession and the connection with prophecy, for example prophecy is really the springboard into the pool of prayer. For instance, a lot of the prophets in the bible were intercessors so I definitely feel it plays a large role in seeing the prophetic come to pass in our lives. So we really believe in the power of prayer and it's not just about petitioning but about worship and the

prayers of the saints that are caught up in the bowls of heaven.

So if this is the case then we seek to create a place of intercession, so at the moment we have like 14 hours a week set apart for worship and intercession. We also have prayer cells within our church that are 'traditional' prayer meetings also, but we really enjoy this combination of worship and intercession. The worship is extolling the Lord and agreeing with who He is, and then the intercession is agreeing with what He wants to do. So for instance, we will have an intercession cell praying for the peace of Israel as it tells us to do in the Word, we are the watchmen on the wall – so we pray for Israel. We pray for peace and for the veil to be lifted from the Jewish people. Then we will pray for Canada, we will pray for our government, the houses of prayer in Canada and the bride of Christ in Canada. We have seen so much movement since praying for Canada our government has become much more righteous than it has ever been and we just pray for things that the Lord just puts on our hearts to pray for...and then we have times of just praying in the Word.


*John replied in the words of the prophet Isaiah: "I am a voice shouting in the wilderness, Clear the way for the LORD's coming!"*

John 1:23

Zacharias' went to exercise his duty of burning incense in the temple at Jerusalem, an angel of the Lord appeared and announced to him that his wife would give birth to a son, whom he was to name John, and that this son would be the forerunner of the Lord. Zacharias did not believe this as the thinking of the world swept in. He thought of their advanced age and knew that his wife was barren he asked with disbelief for a sign whereby he would know the truth of this prophecy. In reply, the angel identified himself as Gabriel, sent especially by God to make this announcement. However, he added that because of Zechariah's doubt he would be struck dumb and "not able to speak, until the day that these things shall be performed". Consequently, when he went out to the waiting worshippers in the temple's outer courts, he was unable to speak the customary blessing. This is proof of how important John's conception and birth was the Lord didn't want him being fed doubt, if Zacharias would speak the child in the womb would have heard of the doubt of his father that is why the Lord kept him silent, he didn't want the child being fed with doubt after all he is the forerunner for his son coming.

After returning to his house his wife, Elizabeth conceived. John's conception was miraculous after all Elizabeth's womb was dead and it's impossible for infertile woman to bear children even to this day. He was about six months older than Jesus, which was the perfect age gap in his future as it would take John the Baptist a clear six months to build an amazing reputation of a teacher of the word and prophet to prepare the way for Jesus' ministry. It was foretold that this child would be filled with the Spirit of God, even from his mother's womb, and that he would be reared under the strict code of the Nazirite, an indication of the importance it was for John the Baptist to be a preparer for the way of the Messiah.

After Elizabeth completed her fifth month of pregnancy, her cousin Mary was also visited by the angel Gabriel, overshadowed by the Holy Ghost and - though still a virgin - became pregnant with Jesus The Christ. Mary then travelled to visit her cousin Elizabeth, having been told by the angel that Elizabeth was in her sixth month of pregnancy. The angel Gabriel notified Mary of Elizabeth's pregnancy, which shows us that her pregnancy news was not just good family news but the heavens were talking about it. When Mary went to visit her cousin the baby leaped in Elizabeth's womb, and she was filled with the Holy Spirit. This was actually the first meeting between John the Baptist and Jesus The Christ as the baby in Elizabeth leaped when



The story of John the Baptist begins with Zacharias and Elizabeth, who were of a priestly family. Elizabeth was barren and could not bear any children and both she and Zacharias prayed for a child of their own. What is important to note is that the circumstances of the conception of John the Baptist mirrors that of the birth of Isaac who would later be named Israel, his parents were Abraham and Sarah. Abraham and Sarah were of old age and Sarah was barren until she gave birth to Isaac when she was well over 90 years old when God gave Abraham the son that was promised to him through his wife Sarah.

Elizabeth was related to Mary, the mother of Jesus, and her husband was Joseph who is a direct descendant of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This is significant as well as it first showcases the importance of John the Baptist he was related to Jesus The Christ as well as Abraham, Isaac and Jacob though Mary's marriage to Joseph. His miraculous conception and how it mirrors that of Abraham and Sarah is a clear indication of that and God's acknowledgment that through Joseph they are Abraham's children. Zacharias and Elizabeth lived in the "hill country" of Judea. They were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord and were blameless making them perfect parents to this amazing prophet and teacher.

Zacharias and Elizabeth always wanted a child of their own and could not, until one day when

it was in the presence of the Son of God. This shows to us through scripture that unborn children have souls and they have lives. Gabriel could have informed Mary of John the Baptists birth but the angel informed her of the pregnancy showing that God cares for the unborn child of a mother unborn children as equally important to children being born in the world. Mary remained at her cousins for about three months before she returned to her own house.

Elizabeth gave birth soon after Mary left, and on the eighth day, when their son was to be circumcised according to the commandment, her cousins and neighbours assumed that he was to be named after his father. Elizabeth, however, insisted that his name was to be John; so the family then questioned her husband. As soon as Zachariah had written on a writing table: "His name is John", he regained the power of speech, and blessed "the Lord God of Israel" with a prophecy known to some as the Benedictus. The fact that Zachariah blessed his son as John proves to us and to God that Zachariah believed his son was the forerunner for the Son of God. He finally believed the prophecy that the angel Gabriel gave to him and as a reward, he got his speech back.

The Scriptures are silent as to the deaths of John's parents and how his life began to grow it does state in Luke a brief synopsis of his upbringing "*And the child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, and was in the deserts till the day of his showing unto Israel*" (Luke -1:80). This desert area "stretches from Jerusalem and Bethlehem eastward some 20 miles down to the Jordan River and the Dead Sea; it is a barren region of rugged hills and valleys. What is interesting to note is that seeing as John the Baptist grew up in the desert, as soon as Jesus was baptised Jesus was tested in the desert and fasted for forty days and forty nights, past the test of temptation and was ministered to by angels.

The description of John is brief and stark. He was arrayed in a "camel's hair" garment, secured by a leather belt, and his diet was locusts and wild honey (Mt. 3:4). His clothing is quite reminiscent of the adornment of certain Old Testament prophets (Zech. 13:4), particularly Elijah, who, as we have noted, foreshadowed John (cf. 2 Kgs. 1:8). He didn't have any beauty or majesty to attract the people, he wasn't rich or wealthy and never dined at fine restaurants, he ate locusts and honey, which the poorest elements of society in that time ate. If we saw him in the streets today I'd doubt we'd even stop and chat to him, he would have been a homeless beggar today. This is proof to us that power and majesty are not

shown in the outside but from the inside, regardless of his appearance and diet and social class he is remembered as a great teacher and the forerunner for Jesus' ministry.

John was somewhat isolated from the traditional way of living. Jesus once said: "John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, He has a demon" (Mt. 11:18). This shows to us how much Jesus loved John not just as a prophet but as a cousin, he was sticking up for him, *you call my cousin a demon for not indulging in your socialising!* "Eating and drinking" stood for socializing he was not a party-goer, while people today wanted to go out to the clubs, drink and party John would have been the kind of person to stay at home and read a book, which in the eyes of society is 'not normal'. His ascetic life-style appeared almost demonic to others, like those possessed of evil spirits who apparently frequented the desolate areas. He did not seek out the multitudes but like Jesus, he attracted them.

John's mission can be summed up by one word, "preparer." It was his happy chore to prepare a people for the coming Messiah. Both Isaiah and Malachi had announced that he would "prepare" the way for the coming of "Jehovah" – a firm affirmation, incidentally, of the Christ Jesus. The angel Gabriel had informed Zacharias that his son would be instrumental in turning many unto the Lord, going before his face, making ready a people prepared for him. Zacharias himself prophesied that John would be called "the prophet of the Most High" who would "go before the face of the Lord to make ready his ways".

The citizens of Jerusalem and all Judea went out unto him as he moved about in the Jordan Valley. His influence was phenomenal, hundreds, if not thousands, were absolutely immersed by him. His success was solely in the message he proclaimed 'preparing the way of the Lord'. The multitudes said that he performed no "sign," though they regarded his message concerning Christ as true. This passage appears to indicate that John did not perform miracles, as Jesus and the apostles did. It is certainly the case, however, that his message was from God, and thus infallibly true. The power of John's preaching, together with the void in Israel's hearts, was a winning combination of an excellent ministry.

## My Personal Testimony Series

I am here to submit my personal testimony, I really don't have enough pages to write all of it down in detail or indeed all of the things that Jesus has done for me for me!

As a small child, I heard the gospel many times however, all I could remember was hell and God being angry and how He would punish you. So after these children's meetings as a small child I would come home and cry to my daddy and ask over and over if I was saved and if they were saved and then I would go over all my loved ones. This went on for a few years. I used to ask Jesus into my heart all the time, just in case He didn't hear me!

I don't recall anyone really telling me about Jesus' love I only remember the scary things. As I hit my teens I started to forget all about God, I started to develop other interests including smoking at 10 years old and drinking at 13 years, it was only a matter of time and I would start to experiment with drugs at age 15. It developed into a vicious circle all my teenage life. I was confused, I had no idea who I was and always felt a 'gap' in my life. I tried filling this gap with all the worldly things but I was never happy.

At 23, I fell pregnant and suffered severe post-natal depression, which carried on for many years. I was on sleeping pills, anti-depressants including Diazepam for many years. My drinking just got worse and in my depression, I felt as though I was in a bubble all the time. Then I started to develop suicidal thoughts, these haunted me all day and night. I could not get these thoughts out of my head. At one point, I was frightened of what I might do to my child and feared I would even take his life! I went onto a website to find out how I could gas myself and my son in my car. I felt I was out of control in every area of my life. When it came to the bit, I couldn't carry it out because of the deep sense and fear of going to hell. This continued for years and then I met a man who I thought would have helped me but the pain and hurt was still there and my drinking just got worse.

I had a nervous breakdown as a result in Jan 2007, I was referred to psychiatrists and one week before my wedding, I was caught and convicted of drink driving in Aug 2007. I could no longer cope and always had God at the back of my thoughts over all the years of depression. My marriage broke up after only 6 weeks, it was at this point of utter

despair that I knew I had to give my life to God; I couldn't do it on my own anymore. On the 23<sup>rd</sup> October, I gave my life to Jesus! WOW! WOW! What a night! I was immediately set free from my depression, suicidal thoughts and everything else instantly! To my amazement my husband gave his heart to the Lord the very same night just after me and yet neither of us were aware that we had both been saved, when we did we got back together and had a beautiful baby girl together and of course we couldn't name her anything other than Faith!

After a while the problems of the past started to come back and haunt both of us, we separated when Faith was only 6 months old. Although I kept my faith and I loved the Lord for what He had done in my life, I started to get very bitter and angry towards my husband because it was easier for me to hate him than to feel the pain. That's how I coped all my life I buried my pain deep down inside and then turn it into anger. I started divorce proceedings, then on the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2010, I had a house fire and lost all our belongings, through it all I knew that God was carrying me and it was at this point that God really started to work in my life dramatically. He started by making me face and deal with my past hurts one by one. I had cancelled my divorce proceedings in faith just before the fire but my anger started to rise again and divorce proceedings were commenced again a second time following the fire!

All the while though people were praying for me through the Walking in the Light Ministries (UK) Global Prayer Network for my marriage, people in over 29 different countries. Eventually God in His amazing gentle, loving and unforceful way healed me from the inside out! He used my terrible circumstances in my life and worked them all for His glory and honor. It is two years after our initial separation and my husband and I are miraculously re-united. Only God can heal and restore and I love Him more everyday for where He has brought me from what He has done in my life. I thank Him for turning around my situation and how He was able to turn around something that the enemy meant for harm and bad, turn it all for the good, and make all things new.

No matter what trials you are facing hold tight to Jesus and His promise through His sacrifice and atoning blood on the cross His power will turn all this around! Therefore, I would like to offer a big, big thank you to all the Walking in the Light Ministries (UK) Global Prayer Network intercessors for praying and lifting me up in their prayers. They were well and truly answered. God is good always! Keep up the good work and continue seeing lives changed by the power of prayer.

And focus on your grace


Shine on me, mighty son of God

Jesus - my GOD send!

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
