The Hebraic Heart of Leadership

Part 1

The more we discover the true Hebraic nature of the Christian faith, the more we will be challenged to live according to the Scriptures. It is in those pages that we find the revelation of the Kingdom of God and God's invitation for everyone to enter into a personal relationship with the King and partake of the riches of His Kingdom. It is also here that we find the process by which the King trains, i.e. disciples, those who respond to this invitation. Only those who are discipled can be partakers of the riches of the Kingdom. Those who refuse this training never experience the reality of the Kingdom of God in their lives. Central to this process of discipleship is the renewal of our minds and the reformation of our hearts. God teaches us how to think and feel as He does. In this way, he determines whether He can depend on us to respond just like Him, in word, thought and deed, as he entrusts us with more and more authority in His Kingdom. It is this process of learning to emulate God and be entrusted to oversee his kingdom that is at the heart of the Hebraic nature of our faith. The Hebraic faith revealed to us in the pages of Scripture centres on this theme. It is very different than all the other religions of the world. They are cantered on manipulating the deity to serve the purposes of "self." The Hebraic heart is centered on personal transformation into the image of the Messiah and entrustment with greater responsibility in God's Kingdom.

The pages of Scripture paint a picture for us of our King and His kingdom. They show us who he really is, and who we really are. They teach us the way to grow in relationship to him, to others, and even to ourselves. They reveal to us how the King wants His Kingdom to be administrated on the earth. Of central importance to that administration is the quality of its administrators, or using a more familiar Biblical term, its stewards. A steward is someone who is entrusted with responsibility and authority to care for another's possessions. A leader in the Kingdom of God is simply a steward of that which has been entrusted to him by the King. If leaders in the Kingdom are not properly trained, motivated and equipped, then the work of the Kingdom will be seriously compromised and its effectiveness greatly hindered. Leaders in this Kingdom are constantly being instructed and adjusted by the King to have a heart that reflects His own. As we seek the restoration of the Hebraic roots of our faith, we experience more and more impartation of these dynamics by the Holy Spirit. He is trying to give us a Hebraic heart, the heart of a servant who leads, and a leader who serves.

As we study the history of Christianity, we can clearly see how those who were leaders in the church became compromised in various aspects of their leadership qualities. History testifies to how those compromises produced much ungodly fruit. Instead of building the Kingdom of God, compromised leaders built what I call the "empire of self." Instead of surrendering all personal rights, goals, and desires to the authority of the King and then allowing His interests to rule in their hearts, they allowed "self" and its interests to become the controlling influence of their lives. Deceived by the subtleties of "self," they stopped being inspired and empowered by the Holy Spirit. As this deception deepened, the compromised leaders began to do things that protected their own "empires." People, money, and doctrines were manipulated and controlled so that they served the interests of the "emperor" of each "empire," rather than the purposes of the King of Kings.

The tragic result of this deception was the departure from our original Hebraic faith and the creation of a new non-Biblical religion that has generally taken on the title "Christianity." If we are honest, we can see that much of what has been historically called Christianity was, in fact, the formulation of a religion that was not based on the Bible and did not build the Kingdom of God. As you study church history, you will see how "self" interest, though disguised in high-sounding religious language, was at the heart of so many decisions that bore ungodly fruit. The Biblical goal of making disciples (i.e. doing everything necessary to equip and perfect the believers) was completely eradicated by leaders who wanted to build their own empires. The deception was so insidious that this was all done in the name of Jesus and under the supposed authority of the Kingdom of God.

As the church was increasingly removed from her Jewish roots, she grew further and further from the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom was replaced by the "empire of self" that increasingly grew into a political/military force. Using the power of the sword and the threat of eternal damnation, she subjugated individuals and nations, demanding their allegiance to her religious establishment. The Biblical picture of a spiritually empowering, organically relating community of believers that was lovingly ministering to and equipping people to fulfil their calling was virtually unheard of, and when heard of, was persecuted. People were brought into an ecclesiastical system that did not create or nourish a personal relationship with God, or spiritually empower them. Nor did it want to. Its leaders sought to control and manipulate the people so that they themselves could remain in positions of authority and power. They were spiritually compromised, and the fruit of that compromise was (and unfortunately still is today) people who themselves had (and still have) no real spiritual relationship with God and therefore no fruit of the Spirit in their own lives. Instead of building the Kingdom of God, they built (and are building) the "empire of self."

Then he paid the price.

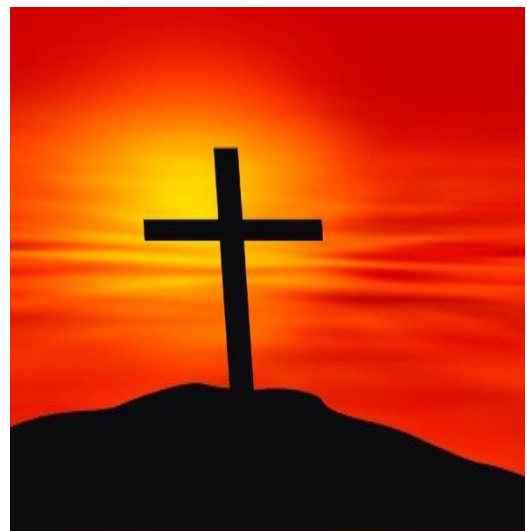

Betsy Natale – Anointed Words

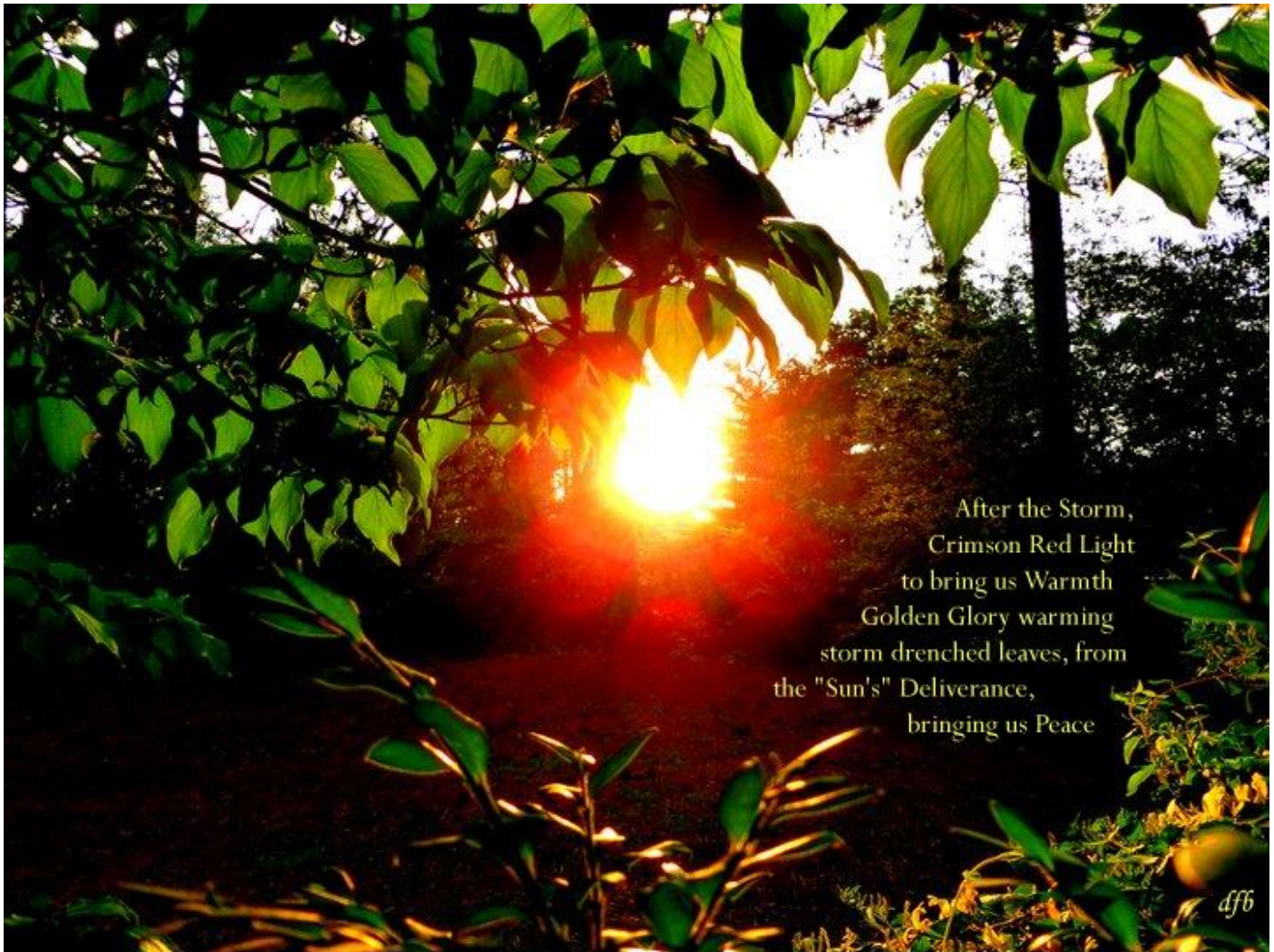
Abiding

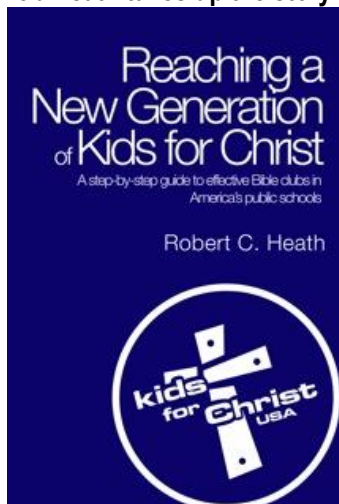


As founder of Kids for Christ USA Bob Heath has planted, or assisted parent and student sponsors of Bible Club in over 60 public elementary, junior high and high school locations in the Tulsa metro area: a place once thought closed to the gospel. Since January of 2001, he and his teams have covered their city on a daily basis taking the gospel of peace to a new generation of Kids for Christ. Since 2005, the vision has expanded into two major California cities, Indiana, Michigan, North Carolina, Iowa, Massachusetts, Kansas, New Jersey, Texas, and Tennessee. To date they have assisted in the launch of roughly 88 Bible clubs across the USA.

He believes that the greatest mission on earth is the Public Elementary Schools. In the past nine years Kids for Christ USA has seen in excess of 10,000 children make decisions to serve Jesus with their lives and over 4,000 people lead to Jesus by inspired children who are implementing the tools that Kids for Christ USA has taught them.

Bob Heath takes up the story himself:



In 1963, the myth that the Bible was taken out of the schools began to grow. As a result, The Bible was effectively removed from the daily lives of many of America's children. Today a "show of hands" in a typical crowd proves that 8 out of 10 believe this myth is actually the truth. One of our goals and part of our vision is to educate the body of Christ that only

mandatory Bible reading and prayer were removed not voluntary.

Our calling and purpose is to assist in planting and facilitating Bible clubs in every public school in the USA. Whether hands on or by our influence, the aim is pouring a vision into the nation, not building a kingdom for KFCUSA. If we all work together we will succeed and we will begin see a nationwide movement that changes this land.

We see ourselves as a synapse, connecting people and resources for effective Bible Clubs in America's schools.

Our purpose is simple:

- Reach children in the public schools with the good news of Jesus Christ.
- Encourage young believers in their faith; enabling them to live consistently in Christ.
- Train and equip young believers with what they need to win others to Christ.

We believe that by doing these things we will positively affect our schools and our children's lives. Just as yeast permeates every part of the dough so also will our influence permeate the schools. Lives will be changed and every part of our society will consequently be affected.

Kids for Christ USA have 55 volunteers in Tulsa who help run clubs. Of the 55, there are 12 actual kids and youth ministers, the rest are what most would call "lay-people".

Kids for Christ USA need about double that number as we are intending to double in size in the next 12-18 months both here in Tulsa and across the U.S. Every club runs best with a four man team. We work with ministers of all major denominations. My heart is reaching kids and families, not doctrine. What I mean is that we teach "a simple, central gospel message". We leave the doctrinal issues of the various denominations to be taught in the churches. We are there to love kids, to be the hands and feet of Jesus to kids who may or may not have a "church home".

On a national level, there are over 60,000 + elementary schools and presently working with 102. To most people this sounds great and don't misunderstand me it is, but it has taken 10 years to get to this number. That means that we have grown at a rate of about 10 schools a year. At the present rate, we will reach all the schools in the land in about 6,000 years. So to answer your question we need parents/students to sponsor clubs, we need people who wish to volunteer, we need ministers, and we need the Body of Christ. My vision is to empower people to launch clubs, not build an empire that I lord over!

I am called to the schools of the USA, but that does not mean I don't have a heart for the schools of the world. I

know the laws here; therefore, I am most effective here. I would be honoured to help folks in other lands who are willing to do their own legal research. I can help implement concepts, I can train people, but I have found that there are many cultural differences that can be at the very least limiting. I have turned down several people in Pakistan and parts of South Africa after spending 24 days in Tanzania two summers ago. There are many reasons for this not the least of this is budgetary. Your nation and Germany seem to be willing to help with the expenses if not pay them. Also, your laws are similar enough that I can be "useful" in establishing a work there. I desperately need at least two staff members as soon as possible. I need an Administrator and a Tulsa Ministry Director so that I can begin to focus on the bigger vision as mentioned above. The challenge is again budget.

Dwight Moody Part 2

Dwight L. Moody visited Britain with Ira D. Sankey, with Dwight preaching and Sankey singing and together they published books of Christian hymns. In 1883 they visited Edinburgh and raised £10,000 for the building of a new home for the Carrubbers Close Mission. Dwight later preached at the laying of the foundation stone for what is one of the few buildings on the Royal Mile, which continues to be used for its original purpose and is now called the Carrubbers Christian Centre.

Dwight greatly influenced the cause of cross-cultural Christian missions after he met the pioneer missionary to China, Hudson Taylor. He actively supported the China Inland Mission and encouraged many of his congregation to volunteer for service overseas. His influence was felt among Swedes despite the fact that he was of English heritage, never visited Sweden or any Scandinavian country, and never spoke a word of the Swedish language. Nevertheless, he became a hero revivalist among Swedish Mission Friends in Sweden and America.

News of Dwight's large revival campaigns in Great Britain from 1873–1875 travelled quickly to Sweden, making "Mr. Moody" a household name. Dwight's sermons published in Sweden were distributed in books, newspapers, and colporteur tracts, and led to the spread of Sweden's "Moody fever" from 1875–1880.

He preached his last sermon on November 16, 1899 in Kansas City, Kansas. Becoming ill, he returned home by train to Northfield. During the preceding several months, friends had observed he had added some 30 pounds to his already ample frame. Although his illness was never diagnosed, it has been speculated that he suffered congestive heart failure. He died on December 22, surrounded by family. Already installed by Dwight as leader of his Chicago Bible

Institute, R. A. Torrey succeeded Moody as its president. Ten years after his death, the Chicago Avenue Church was renamed The Moody Church in his honor, and the Chicago Bible Institute was likewise renamed Moody Bible Institute.

A CASE OF PERSPECTIVE

"The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed" Romans 8:10

Champeï was a young attractive seventeen year old who left her home in the village to earn a living, only to pay the heaviest price of all. This is a summary of her journey:

At seventeen, young and beautiful Champei, persuaded by a friend, made the decision to head to the city in search of work. Within hours of her arrival, the same friend who had enticed her there with the promise of money mercilessly raped her. Herein began a fourteen year ordeal of untold heartache and tragedy. As if to try and mend Champei's torn spirit the "friend" found her a job as a seamstress. And yet even there she found no relief from the predatory ways of those around her. She was soon being used and abused to deviant ends only now she was being paid to satisfy their perverse pleasures. By the age of twenty-three she had become a fully fledged prostitute, managed by a handful of heartless and merciless men who shared in the spoils.

One day she found out she was pregnant and for a few months her profession was put on hold. The inevitable financial strain set in and immediately on giving Birth Champei gave her baby away. Within little time she returned to her sordid life which had enslaved her.

Sadly a much worse revelation was about to be made – she was HIV positive. Unable to give up on her lifestyle she continued to pay for the drugs she now needed to slow down the disease. Hardened, calloused and even vengeful, she continued to sell her services to hundreds of clients who were unaware that they were effectively signing their own death warrant.

Eventually she could no longer hide the disfiguring marks of her disease. Blisters blanketed her body. One day Champei could take

no more and ingested a poison before laying down for the last time in her small home and setting it on fire. She died totally alone – her once beautiful body reduced to ashes.

Champeï's story is sadly not unique with many millions of men and women are enticed into this trap every year. Recent UNICEF figures tell us that 2 million children alone are sold into sexual slavery every year. Over 27 million people are held in slavery of some form – and this in 2011.

How do we respond to accounts like this of Champei? Are we saddened, despairing, frustrated, heartbroken, or has the modern culture of the society around us infected our worldview. Do we simply read and move on, unaffected by the misery and suffering of a young woman we have never met who lives in a country we have no desire to know about? Are we simply slumbering whilst many in our world live in tormented situations unable to escape?

But then again you might be someone who wants to change the status quo despite the somewhat overwhelming statistics. Often it is these very figures which keep us in the starting blocks, suffering from a virtual paralysis, overpowered by the magnitude of the challenge we face and convincing ourselves that nothing we can do will make a difference. On the other hand there are those who will dive in with naïve enthusiasm underestimating the issues, only to burn out from discouragement after a few setbacks. Neither of these approaches is useful if you truly want to follow Christ's example in carrying the good news in tangible ways through this hurting world. We need to become realists – a people who see the possibilities between the obstacles and the opportunities.

In a recent conversation with a friend who is a professional photographer he pointed out the most common difference between a poor photograph and a great photograph. "It's all a matter of our perspective". And that is the situation in this instance too. We need to adjust our perspective and mindset to that of Jesus. As we look upon the pain and suffering in the world what do we see? Do we see a malnourished child – or do we see a future farmer? A child without schooling – or a potential teacher? Do we see a frightened child huddling in the confines of a refugee camp – or do you see a future world leader? When you look into the eyes of the poor, malnourished, downtrodden and marginalised, do you see the situation as hopeless – or do we see a people made in the very image of God, with all the prospects of a hope filled future ahead of them?

All too often as Christians, Christ's ambassadors, we can look at our broken world, shrug our shoulders and say, "That's just the way things are." Instead we can shift our perspective and embrace the vision of what could be – if only we would step up to the mark. Surely it is better to light a candle than curse the darkness. And dare to imagine what can be achieved if we lit not one candle but many...

Rain down on me

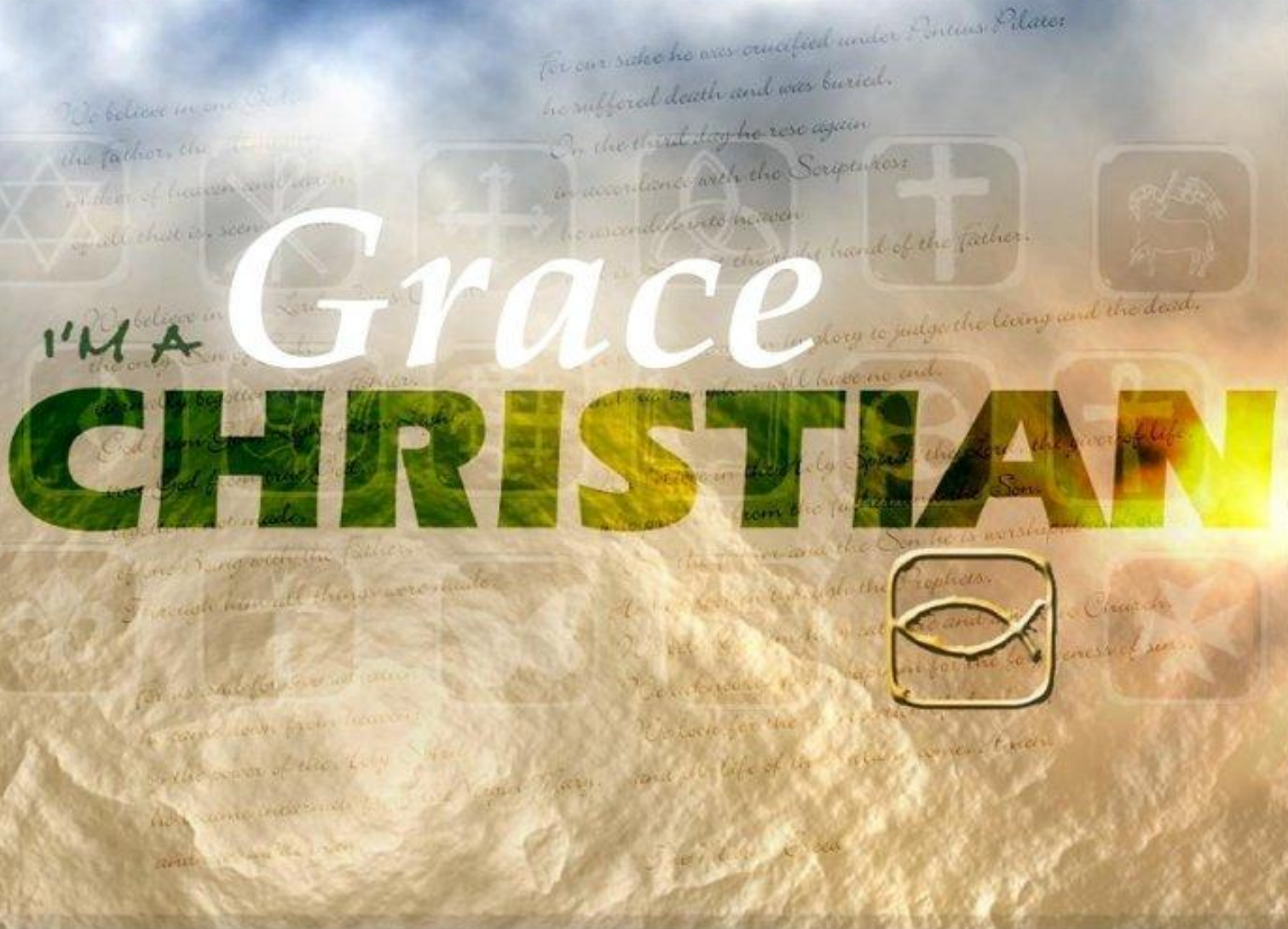
