Arenas: Introductory classes and USEA tests will be ridden in a small arena (20x40). Training Level and above will be ridden in a large arena (20x60).

Footing: Competition arena footing is M-10. **Warm-up will be on a level grass field.**

COVID-19 Save Practices Disclosure:

In an effort to minimize the chance of exposure and transmission of the virus we will be implementing the following:

- All entries must be complete prior to your arrival to avoid unnecessary contact with the show office staff. All paperwork and payment must be mailed or emailed to the secretary prior to the show.
- Show numbers will not be provided to the competitor. Competition number sets are available at Dover Saddlery for less than \$10. Or you can make your own and pin them to your saddle pad. Or do without.
- Please adhere to social distancing protocols. No large groups, No congregating around the posted results or prize table. Wearing masks when in the presence of others is required.

We are taking these preventative measures to try and reduce the spread of Covid-19, however, attending this event could increase your risk of contracting the coronavirus. Entries:

- One entry per horse/rider combination per show. Mail or email entry and payment to the Secretary at address given below. Or enter online at equestrianentries.com.
- Online entries may be paid online by credit card (a small fee applies) or an entry form printed out and mailed with a check (made out to MILYM Equestrian) for full fees to secretary.
- Regardless of method of payment, a signed GDCTA hold harmless and current coggins must be mailed, or emailed to:

- Entries must be in the secretaries hand before closing date. Entries may be accepted after closing date if space permits and late fee paid.
- Checks should be made out to Milym Equestrian.
- Contact show secretary if you have any questions prior to entering the show.

Awards:

- Ribbons awarded through 6th place. Classes will be split into Junior and Adult divisions if entries warrant.
- High Point awards will be awarded to the horse/rider with the highest and second highest score in Dressage.
- High Point awards are sponsored by Choice of Champions International makers of supplements for healthy horses.
- * Lisa Seger Insurance Medal will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Amateur in Training Level Test 3. Winner will be eligible for the Final to be held at the GDCTA Schooling Show in August

Series High Point Award:

- Must participate in at least 2 of the 3 shows and have at least 4 scores.
- Winner will be the horse/rider combination with the highest average score from all their scores received at our shows.
- Series Awards sponsored by Choice of Champions, makers of supplements for healthy horses.

Refunds: Scratches prior to or on closing date: all fees except office fee will be refunded. Scratches after closing date: credit for all fees less office fee for a future show will be given with vet or doctor's excuse. Credit must be used within 1 year of scratched show. Inclement weather is not a valid excuse for scratching.

Substitutions: Substitution of horse or rider before or after the closing date will require a new entry form with a new office fee. Class fees will be transferred to the new entry.

Confirmation/Times: Confirmation of entry will be by email. All email addresses must be clearly printed on entry form. Ride times will be posted on website (www.bellaroseeq.com) and emailed to competitors Wednesday before the show. It is the responsibility of the competitor to notify management of any ride conflicts as soon as possible after times have been published.

Stabling: Limited stabling available at \$50 per day. Haul-in fee required for non-stabled horses.

Non-Compete Horse: Non-competite horses are welcome as space permits. A complete entry is required along with coggins, signatures and office fee, haul-in fee, and non-competite horse fee paid.

Special Classes: If there is a class you would like to compete in and you don't see it here, just ask. We'll do our best to accommodate you.

Dress: Formal attire encouraged but not mandatory. Polo shirts acceptable. No tee shirts. Half chaps are permitted. ASTM/SEI helmets mandatory when mounted and appropriate footwear required.

Management reserves the right to refuse or limit entries, to add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition herein for the improvement of the competition. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis before the closing date.

If you wish to participate in the USDF Regional Award Program you must include your horse's HID number and the rider and owner's USDF numbers on your entry.

USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program Rules (See USDF website for complete rules)

General Information:

1. Program year is December 1 through November 30.
2. Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
3. Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

1. Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
4. Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned.
5. Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 21 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
6. Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.
7. Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the competition.
8. Only USDF members in good standing are eligible to compete in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program and receive awards.

Award Divisions & Levels:

1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:
 - a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
 - b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21.
 - c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card.
 - d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
2. Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division:
 - a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions)
 - b. Training
 - c. First
 - d. Second
 - e. Third
 - f. Fourth
 - g. FEI – combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores

GDCTA Hold Harmless Clause

The undersigned competitor/rider and all signors below hereby (1) agrees to release the management of this show or clinic, their officers, directors, employees, members, or agents, and the owners or managers of the grounds where this event is held, from any loss, damage, liability, or injury arising out of or resulting from this show or clinic or competitors/riders participation therein; (2) agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc., the organizer, facility owner, and the management of this show or clinic from and against any and all claims for loss, damage, liability, or injury, however caused, resulting directly or indirectly from competitors/riders entry or participation in this show or clinic or from acts or omissions of competitor/rider or competitor's agents; and (3) acknowledges that activities with and around horses and horse shows or clinics involve inherent risks including but not limited to substantial risk of bodily injury, death, property damage and other dangers including, but not limited to, bodily injury or death resulting from kicks and bites, falling off horse or horse(s) falling on Rider, being dragged by a foot caught in the stirrups, Rider being thrown by horse, equipment failure or collision with horse(s) or vehicles or other inanimate objects, as well as any and all risks of contracting Covid-19. In the event of injury to competitor/rider or to competitor's/rider's animals, permission is hereby granted to management for emergency medical treatment.

Every entry at a Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc. (GDCTA) recognized competition or clinic shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that all participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, handler, the horse, volunteers and staff), for themselves, their principals, representatives, employees, and agents: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the GDCTA and the local rules of the competition or clinic; (2) represent that every horse, rider, driver, and handler is eligible as entered; (3) agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and of the competition or clinic, and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition or clinic, the GDCTA, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, they authorize the GDCTA and the competition or clinic management to market, transfer, assign, or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, audiotapes, or videotapes taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to, or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the event, sport, or the GDCTA, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status nor endorses a specific product or service, and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and (5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition or clinic fully aware that horse sports and the competition or clinic involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold harmless the GDCTA, the competition or clinic, and the officials, directors, employees, and agents from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competition or clinic, whether or not such claim, injury, or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the GDCTA, competition or clinic. The construction and application of USEF Rules are governed by laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against USEF must be filed in New York State, see Article 1502.5.

1. 2. I understand the potential dangers that I could incur in mounting, riding, walking, boarding, feeding said horse; including, but not limited to any interactions with other horses. Understanding those risks I hereby release Milym Equestrian LLC (dba BellaRose Equestrian) and Miriam Offermanns and Manuel Offermanns and Amber LoPresti and the Family and Employees of The Offermanns, its officers, directors, shareholders, employees and anyone else directly or indirectly connected with Milym Equestrian LLC (dba BellaRose Equestrian) and Miriam Offermanns and Manuel Offermanns and Amber LoPresti and the Family and Employees of The Offermanns from any liability whatsoever in the event of injury or damage of any nature (or perhaps even death) to me or anyone else caused by or incidental to my electing to mount and ride said horse(s).

I understand and recognize and warrant that this Release and Hold Harmless Agreement, is being voluntarily and intentionally signed and agreed to, and that in signing this Release and Hold Harmless Agreement I know and understand that this Release and Hold Harmless Agreement may further limit the liability of equine professionals to include any activity, whatsoever, involving an equine, including death, personal injury and/or damage to property.

4. I recognize and agree that I know which equine professional(s) I will be working with, and acknowledge that I agree said equine professional(s) has/have made reasonable and prudent efforts to determine my ability to engage in the equine activity, and has/have sufficient knowledge of my equine and horseback riding skills as to relieve, release and hold harmless said equine professional(s) from any continuing duty to monitor my equine activities.

5. I further voluntarily agree and warrant to Release and Hold Harmless this (these) equine professional(s) from any liability whatsoever, including, but not limited to, any incident caused by or related to said equine professionals negligence, relating to injuries known, unknown, or otherwise not herein disclosed; including, but not limited to, injuries, death or property damage from: mounting; riding; dismounting; walking; grooming; feeding; use of horse barn, paddock, trails or horse ring or at competitions, in any capacity; falling off horse whether horse is bucking, rearing, flipping, spooked; or my failure to understand any equine professional's directions relating to my riding or otherwise use and control, or lack thereof, of my horse or the horse I have been assigned to.
