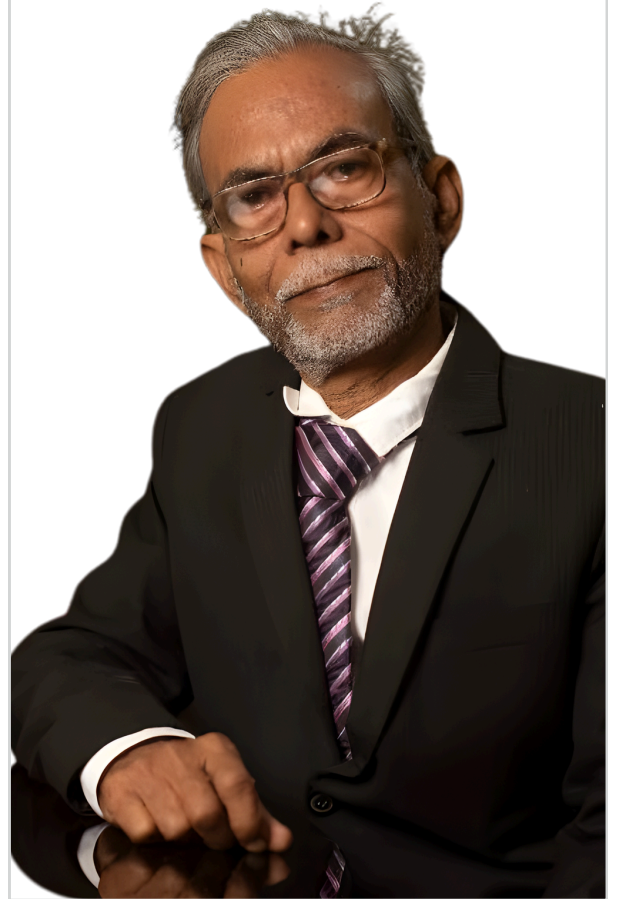

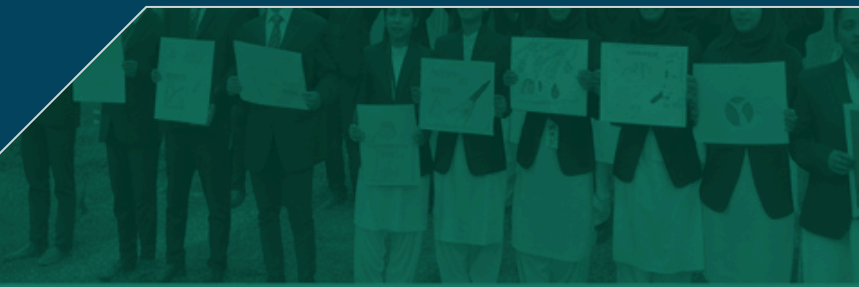

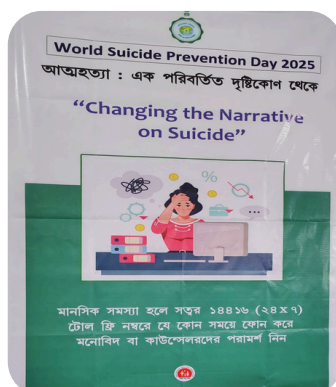

Ragging Free Campus

A Ragging Free Campus is the absolute baseline of a safe and dignified academic environment at a modern institution like the MAB Institute of Juridical Science. It means enforcing a policy of Zero Tolerance where students can focus entirely on their studies and professional socialization without fear, harassment, or intimidation.

Key Pillars of a Ragging-Free Environment

- **Legislative Action:** The institution operates under the full mandate of the UGC Regulations (2009) and the relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), which strictly outlaw all forms of ragging.
- **Proactive Measures:**
 - **Anti-Ragging Committee:** A high-level committee comprising senior faculty, police representatives, and student delegates monitors the campus 24 x 7.
 - **Anonymous Helplines:** Displaying the mandatory National Anti-Ragging Helpline numbers and maintaining anonymous drop boxes for reporting incidents.
- **Positive Induction:** Traditional "ragging" is replaced by a formal Fresher's Orientation and Welcome Programme, which focuses on building healthy senior-junior mentorship, networking, and introducing the legal aid clinic and moot court activities.

The Consequences of Ragging

Ragging is not "harmless fun"; it is an offense with serious legal consequences, including:

1. Immediate expulsion from the college.
2. Permanent debarring from other educational institutions.
3. Criminal prosecution under appropriate IPC sections (which can include heavy fines and imprisonment).



Community Engagement



LEGAL AID CLINIC

The Legal Aid Clinic at a law college like the MAB Institute of Juridical Science acts as a bridge between the classroom and the community, embodying the constitutional mandate of "Justice for All".

Access to Justice & Practical Learning

- **Pro Bono Service:** The clinic provides free legal advice and documentation assistance to the underprivileged, ensuring that economic barriers do not prevent access to the legal system.
- **Student-Led Advocacy:** Under the supervision of faculty and empanelled advocates, students gain "hands-on" experience by handling real-world legal queries, drafting petitions, and conducting client counseling.
- **Legal Awareness Camps:** Students regularly travel to nearby villages and urban centers to conduct awareness drives (often through Nukkad Nataks or street plays) on topics like women's rights, consumer protection, and government schemes.
- **Para-Legal Training:** The clinic serves as a training ground where students act as Para-Legal Volunteers (PLVs), helping marginalized individuals navigate administrative hurdles like filing RTIs or applying for social security benefits.

DAYS OF NATIONAL IMPORTANCE

In a law college, Independence Day (August 15) and Republic Day (January 26) are not just holidays—they are powerful reminders of the legal and political evolution of India. For a law student, these days represent the transition from colonial rule to a nation governed by the Rule of Law.

Independence Day:

- It is a day to reflect on the sacrifices of freedom fighters—many of whom were lawyers themselves—and to discuss the historical shifts from colonial statutes to independent governance.

Republic Day: The Triumph of the Constitution

- This is arguably one of the most important days for law students. It highlights the supremacy of the Constitution and the guarantee of Fundamental Rights and Duties.



NATIONAL LAW DAY

National Law Day, also known as Constitution Day (or Samvidhan Divas), is celebrated in India on November 26th every year. For a law college, this is perhaps the most significant date on the academic calendar.

- Commemoration: It marks the day in 1949 when the Constituent Assembly of India formally adopted the Constitution, which later came into force on January 26, 1950.
- The Preamble Reading: The day usually begins with a collective reading of the Preamble, reaffirming the commitment to justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity.
- Constitutional Literacy: It serves as a platform for seminars, symposiums, and debates where students analyze the "Living Constitution" and its evolving nature through judicial interpretations.
- Honoring the Founders: It is a day to pay tribute to the 284 members of the Constituent Assembly—the legal architects who drafted the world's longest written constitution.

Moot Court Training & Competitions

Moot Court Training is the laboratory of legal education. At the MAB Institute of Juridical Science, this training transitions students from "knowing the law" to "practicing the law" by simulating the environment of high-court or Supreme Court proceedings.

Competitions: The Testing Ground

- *Internal Moots: Conducted within the college to select the best orators and researchers to represent the institution.*
- *National & International Moots: High-achieving students compete at prestigious events like the Bar Council of India Trust Moot or the Jessup International Law Moot, gaining exposure to elite legal minds.*
- *Awards & Recognition: Competitions offer titles like "Best Mooter," "Best Memorial," and "Best Researcher," which significantly enhance a law student's CV for future placements.*

The Courtroom Layout

To succeed in competitions, students must understand the physical and procedural geography of the courtroom:



Mock Trial Advocacy Training & Competitions

Mock Trial Advocacy is a highly specialised form of experiential learning that places students in the shoes of trial lawyers, requiring them to manage evidence, examine witnesses, and navigate the complex procedural rules of a Trial Court.

Mock Trial training at the MAB Institute of Juridical Science focuses on the "art of the trial"—the strategic presentation of facts and evidence.

- The Art of Examination-in-Chief and Cross-Examination.
- Handling Evidence: Training includes the technical process of "marking" and "exhibiting" documents and physical objects according to the Indian Evidence Act.
- Role-Playing: Teams consist of both Advocates and Witnesses. Students playing witnesses must "act" their parts based on a witness statement, remaining consistent even under intense cross-examination.
- Participants are judged on their ability to maintain courtroom decorum, their command over the facts, and their spontaneous reactions to "surprises" during the trial.

Course Details, Seat Capacity, Duration & Admission Procedure

- **Course Details:**

The 5-Year Integrated B.A. LL.B. (Honours) program under the University of Kalyani

- **Seat Capacity:**

The intake capacity for 5-Year Integrated B.A. LL.B. (Honours) program is 60 (sixty).

- **Duration:**

5 Years (10 Semesters)

- **Admission Procedure:**

The admission procedure for the 5-year Integrated B.A. LL.B. (Honours) program involves a primary application and Direct Counselling, where students must appear in person to verify their credentials and secure their seats.

Eligibility

- **Age:**

As per Bar Council of India

- **Educational Qualifications:**

Minimum aggregate score in the Higher Secondary (H.S.) or equivalent (10+2) examination from a recognized board (WBCHSE, CBSE, ISC, etc.) must be as follows:

• General Category	45%
• OBC Category	42%
• SC / ST Category	40%

Fee Structure

- **Application - cum - Admission**

- **Fee:**

- Rs. 5000/- (Rupees five thousand only) payable ONE TIME at the time of admission.

- **Tuition Fee:**

- Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees two lacs only) payable in ten equal instalments. 1st Instalment payable at the time of admission. Rest instalments payable on or before of each of the 31st December and 30th June. The Fee payment schedule will be provided at the time of admission.

- **Registration Fee:**

- Rs. 20,500/- (Rupees twenty thousand five hundred only) payable ONE TIME at the time of admission.

Fee Structure

- **Court Visit Fee:**

Total Rs. 20,000/- (Rupees twenty thousand only) payable in 09 (Nine) instalments. 1st Instalment of Rs. 4000/- will be payable along with the tuition fee of 2nd Semester, and the remaining must be paid in equal instalments of Rs. 2000/- along with the semester tuition fees

- **Examination Fee:**

As and when the University of Kalyani directs.

- **Co-curricular Activity Fee:**

Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred) per Semester payable along with Semester fee.
