#### CORONAVIRUS COVID-19 UPDATE

It's still here and doesn't appear to be going anywhere soon. Regression now appears to be the norm. While new coronavirus cases in Illinois dipped slightly, infection rates continued to rise in other parts of the country, particularly the West Coast and the Sun Belt.

California is shutting down again, banning indoor dining and closing movie theaters and bars. In Oregon, gatherings are being limited to no more than 10 people and masks are mandatory statewide. While Sun Belt states have been hit especially hard, most notably Florida, infection rates in Colorado, Kentucky, Montana, North Dakota and the District of Columbia are also rising.

The number of confirmed cases of the coronavirus around the world has now topped 14.5 million. The United States rose to over 3.7 million with 139,700 deaths. Closer to home, Illinois has over 163,000 cases with 7,500 deaths. Cook County hit 98, 670 with almost 5,000 deaths of which Chicago accounts for 57,000 cases and over 2,700 deaths.
