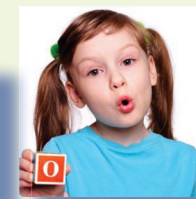

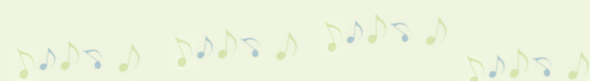
Mark's Story

Consumer is Reaching for the Stars

Mark Dunnom started with Employment Services in July, 2012. Mark came to Sertoma Centre with several years of experience working at Taco Bell. He worked with the Employment Services team to assist with finding new employment.

Mark obtained employment working at Sertoma Centre's Janitorial Services in July, 2013. He started working at Sertoma's 123rd street location and eventually transferred over to 127th street. You can always find Mark working hard throughout the building and with a big smile on his face, kind and always friendly.

This year Mark will be celebrating five years working at Sertoma Centre!



Toronto's Story

Eighteen years ago, an anxious single parent and her 4 year old son sat patiently in the waiting room of Sertoma Speech and Hearing Centers. Her son was newly diagnosed as High Functioning Autistic with Hyperlexia (a syndrome that is characterized by a child's precocious ability to read (far above what would be expected at their age), significant difficulty in understanding and using verbal language (or a profound nonverbal learning disability), and significant problems during social interactions). A label. What did it mean for his future?

That first session was difficult for Toronto, his mother and Dr. Morrison (the clinician). Toronto was verbal but had learned to speak using scripts from 'The Simpsons'. Yes, mistakes were announced with "D'Oh!" He was also a very emotional child and cried frequently due to frustration or lack of understanding. But he could read-fluently. So, we used his reading ability to learn new scripts and replaced 'The Simpson's' language with more spontaneous, typical language. As time went on, Toronto demonstrated keen sports knowledge, particularly for hockey and baseball. At age 5, Toronto declared he was going to play professional hockey. He had not yet learned to skate but he was adamant he would play hockey.



None of this language development happened without challenges. Toronto received special education services and support as well as speech therapy at Sertoma. Sertoma staff advocated for Toronto during IEP meetings, supported mom when she requested additional school supports or when the time had come to reduce support. Toronto continued to demonstrate growth and increasing independence. He began advocating for himself and learned to skate. Toronto learned how to make friends and how to communicate with others through sports.

Toronto attended Morgan Park Academy and excelled academically earning National Honor Society membership. He was a member of several clubs, made friends and as a senior he took not 1, but 2 beautiful young ladies to Prom. Relationships! His social language and interpersonal relationships were truly blossoming. Oh, and he played club hockey!

He was accepted to Robert Morris University and majored in Business Administration. Toronto has maintained a 2.95 GPA and played collegiate hockey. He is a member of the RMU Eagles Men's Hockey team, accepted for who he is, expected to contribute to the team as a Forward. Toronto graduated from RMU in May, 2018. He plans to continue on to graduate school with a focus on Sports Management and serve as a Graduate Assistant with the RMU Hockey team.

Toronto experienced extra challenges but extra talents, too. He is a success because his mother insisted on early intervention, a strong support system, set the bar high for him academically and insisted on independence. Toronto also has a very strong desire to achieve his goals and overcome any barriers in his way. His current goal is to learn to drive. Toronto will always be a man with autism but it does not define him or his success. Sertoma Speech and Hearing Centers is proud to have been a part of Toronto's journey and wish him continued success in all of his future endeavors.
