
#### Chas Lazzara

## WINDS/DERECHO/TORNADOS



Monday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, our weather produced storms that left many Chicagoland residents with major storm damage and without power.

High winds that reached 100 miles per hour caused damage across the Chicago area and suburbs.



The storms that rolled in took utility lines and trees with it. Hundreds of thousands were left without power. Some of those did not have their power restored until Friday.



Fortunately, what was damaged can be replaced. And there were no reports of injuries.

15 tornadoes were confirmed in the area covering northern Illinois and northwest Indiana. This ties June 22, 2016 as the second most tornadoes within that area. The winds, described as a *derecho*, produced 20 confirmed tornadoes across Illinois, Wisconsin and Indiana.

A *derecho* produces a swath of particularly damaging thunderstorm winds over an area at least 250 miles long. These are primarily classified as straight-line winds rather than tornadic.
