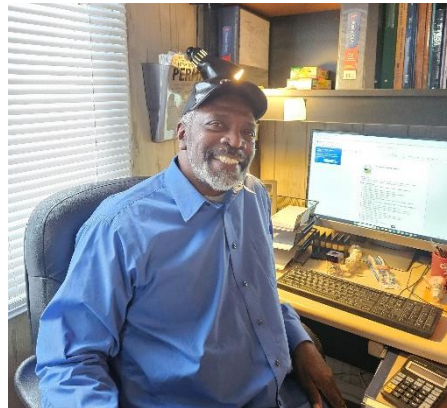

Alpha M. Brady has and is making history daily. Alpha grew up in Pembroke Township, her parents are Rev. Hezekiah and Mrs. Myrna Brady. Alpha went to elementary school at the Pembroke Consolidated School, graduated from the Christian Institute for Developing Altruistic Leaders (CIDAL), earned her B.S. Degree in Business Administration and History from Elmhurst College, and her Juris Doctorate Degree (J.D.) from Northwestern University Pritzker School of Law. She is licensed to practice law in the State of Illinois.



The Purpose of the American Bar Association

The ABA is a private organization with no official status but is vital in formulating guidelines for the best practice of law, advocating justice in the implementation of the law, giving direction to legislation and ethics, promoting the law profession, and vetting federal judges. Moreover, the ABA provides practical resources for legal professionals, promotes the highest quality of legal education, and facilitates the exchange of ideas and information among its members.

Alpha M. Brady, executive director of the ABA delivering her "State of the Association" report to delegates of the association's policy-making body. Brady delivered her remarks on Feb. 5 during the House of Delegates one-day session that closed the 2024 ABA Midyear Meeting in Louisville, Kentucky.

Ms. Brady is a member of the American Bar Association (ABA), the National Association of Women Lawyers, the Association Forum, and the American Society of Association Executives. She serves on the Law Board of Northwestern University Pritzker School of Law. She also serves as President of the Center for Re-Creation and Family Training, Inc (C.R.A.F.T.), Pembroke Township.

Ms. Brady was the ABA's Senior Associate Executive Director and Chief Governance Officer. She has been with the Association since 1988, beginning her tenure with the Commission on Racial/Ethnic Diversity, where she served as Associate Director.

Prior to assuming the position of Executive Director, Ms. Brady served as the Deputy Executive Director of the ABA. She had executive management responsibilities for the Division of Policy and Planning Administration, the Division for Legal Services, the Center for Professional Responsibility, the Division for Bar Services, the Division for Public Education, the Office of Diversity & Inclusion, the Office of the President, and the Center for Innovation. These entities provide management, national leadership, legal policy development, and strategic planning for ABA entities and affiliates.

Ms. Brady, the first person of color to lead the ABA as the Executive Director serves as the executive staff leader of over 1,000 staff in Chicago, IL; Washington, DC; Harlingen, TX; Houston, TX; and San Diego, CA and is responsible for a budget of approximately \$220M, including significant grant funding and 501(c)(3) contributions. Ms. Brady works collaboratively with the Officers of Association to ensure implementation of the mission, goals, and objectives of the ABA.

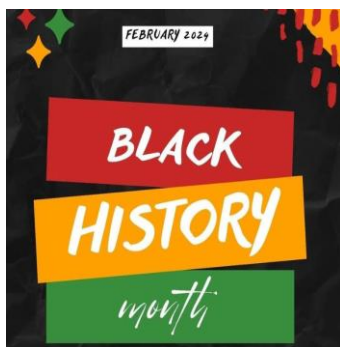


The Black Experience

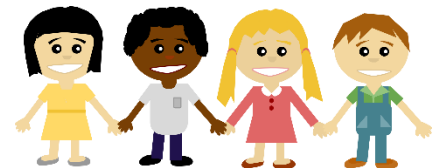

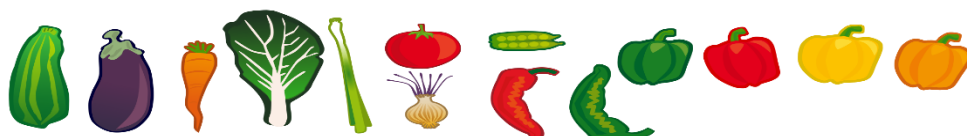

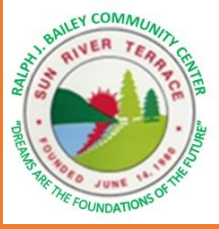
