The new year has kept us busy with many exciting projects and today we are sharing some of the highlights.


Inside the Studio

We've been working on new tracks and expanding our collaboration with other musicians. These works introduced a new challenge...remote recording of live drums.


Sophia's Compleanos

This piece composed by John Lilley is reminiscent of those days racing along the Italian county side in a two-seater sports car.

An original composition by Brent Edmondson, this piece grew when he first took it to John's studio and he played several scorching guitar takes. Brent took the music home and employed our favorite in-house technique, the "slice and dice." By cutting together little bits of John's guitar tracks, there is an incredible

through-line of guitar licks underpinned by synthesizers. Brent even took a solo turn on guitar in the bridge.

It all started when Caroline mistakenly identified a native wasp as an invasive Killer Hornet. Seriously allergic to bee stings, she murdered the wasp only to discover it's the mammoth wasp, Megascolia maculata, the largest wasp in Europe. It thrives in the same environment as the Killer Hornet and looks almost identical, but is not threatening to man, woman, or bees.

Out of guilt, and with great appreciation for our pollinators, without which we would all die, The Insectarium was born.

Once the original score was composed, we added Ken Bell on the French horn to help express the feeling of soaring. John and Brent then added the rhythmic driving beat with the use of taiko drums. Brent is also featured on the cello.

We worked closely with Caroline to capture her vision for this work. This piece is meant to show respect for our insect friends and highlight the beauty of nature.

Works in Progress

Our team continues to compose for Terroir Redux with director John Charles Jopson in Provence.

Dirty Poet Films and crew were back in Marseilles shooting a profile documentary piece on an amazing, obscure, French artist Marius Massot and then back to Chateau de Montfort to continue filming.

We are looking forward to new footage to begin working with in the next two weeks.

Anatomy of a Sound

by Brent Edmondson

Two years ago, I would have been the last person on earth you would want to ask about sound design. As a classical bass player, I was concerned with one sound source and at best 2-3 methods of making it. I had never even taken the time to figure out how to properly pluck



the bass like most jazz and improvising players. Something changed, and for me the change came in the form of an album called Anima by Radiohead singer Thom Yorke. It began an exploration of electronic music, synthesizers, electricity itself, and finally the recording medium in general. Now, you almost have to force me to go back to practicing double bass solos because I'm too engrossed in Pro Tools and noodling with little lines and bits of code!
