Enclosed in an application for membership in Stony Brook Rod & Gun Club. In order to become a member, you must complete the following steps.

- 1) Fill out the application completely, including references section. For a sponsor, list the Club Member that knows you. If you do not know anyone at the club, leave it blank.
- 2) Obtain a Statewide BCI (Bureau of Criminal Identification) check. This can be obtained from your local police department or the Attorney General's office located at 150 South Main St. Providence RI. There is a \$5.00 fee for this service, payable by check or money order. They do not take cash.
- 3) Submit your complete application, including the BCI check, \$50 initiation fee, \$20 building fund assessment, and your first-year dues according to the pro-rated schedule below. Also, be sure to include proof of your current NRA membership (copy of membership card or address label from which ever NRA magazine you currently receive.

Our membership year begins in February. At that time, to renew your membership you must pay annual dues currently set at \$130/year. This applies regarding to the date you join.

If you have a sponsor, you may submit your application by mail addressed to: Stony Brook Rod & Gun Club, PO 345, Lincoln RI 02865

If you do not have a sponsor, you should submit your application in person at the next regular meeting of the club. Meetings are held on the 1st Monday of each month (except July & August) at the clubhouse located at 19 Lower Rd. Lincoln RI 02865. Meetings start at 7:00 PM.

The appearance requirement can be waived for good reason (work, health etc.) In this case, you should arrange to meet with the Club President at a mutually agreeable time for a brief interview. (Contact Bill Renfrew at 724-0770)

- 4) Your application will be presented to the Membership and be posted on the Club Bulletin Board for a period of 30 days. At the <u>next</u> regular meeting of the Club, your application will be brought to a vote. Upon approval of the members, you will be inducted into the Club. <u>You must be present at this meeting to become a member</u>. Exceptions can be arranged for good reason (work, health etc.).
- 5) All new Members have to satisfy a 10-hour work requirement within 12 months after joining the Club. In lieu of 10 hours of work, the Member will be subject to a one-time assessment of \$50.
- 6) Please read the enclosed Range rules.

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#### **Range Rules and Regulations**

(Revised by Executive Board, March 2004)

- 1. Members and guests must sign in upon entering and leaving the club.
- 2. Eye and ear protection must be worn by all persons at the range when shooting is in progress.
- 3. All firing must be done from a minimum distance from the backstop of 50'. This is the red line painted on the floor of the range. Target carriers may be positioned at any range between the backstop and the 25' line. No one will be allowed in front of the firing line unless the line is totally "Safe". The line is safe when all firearms are encased or unloaded with their actions opened and all shooters have stepped back away from the line.
- 4. Dry firing will be allowed at the firing line only.
- 5. Actions must be open at all times except when firing or when gun is encased.
- 6. No shooting at anything other than paper targets. All targets must be on a paper carrier. Targets may not be larger than a standard Army-L target. Targets depicting a realistic image of a person are prohibited. Standard B-29 & B-34 & similar silhouette targets may be used, as they do not depict the realistic image of a person. The smallest target allowed is the NRA B2 or B3 50' bullseye target or one that is equivalent in size (10 ½" wide and 12" long). If you are using a smaller target, it must be attached to a larger piece of paper that is the minimum size stated previously. In either case, the primary impact area of the target (i.e." The center or bullseye) must be a minimum of 6" below the target carrier.
- 7. All handgun shooting must be done from the standing position. No drawing from a holster, shooting from a barricade position, or shooting on the move allowed. Shooters may only shoot at the target in front of their own port (i.e.: No cross firing).
- 8. Members must be qualified by a Range Officer before receiving a range key. Members may qualify with any caliber handgun or .22 caliber rifle. Members may only shoot firearms of caliber equal to or smaller than that which they have qualified with unless a range officer is present.
- 9. Members may only bring 2 guests at a time, (excluding immediate family member) and only one guest or family member may shoot at a time.
- 10. Members and guests must pay the required range fee.
- 11. Guests must observe all safety and range rules at all times.
- 12. Members will oversee and assume all responsibilities for their guest(s).
- 13. Guests are permitted to shoot .22 cal. Rifles and handguns only. This restriction does not apply to Club sanctioned matches or shooting activity associated with organized courses of instruction, or to persons being qualified for the RI Carry permit by a Stony Brook Officer who is also an NRA Certified Instructor. A fee of \$10 will be charged to the non-member for this service.
- 14. There will be no alcoholic beverages consumed on club property without the express permission of the Executive Board.
- 15. Range officers will be designated by the Club President.
- 16. Only mid-range or standard loads are allowed. No Magnum loads or Jacketed rounds in any caliber are allowed.
- 17. A maximum of five rounds may be loaded in any pistol or revolver in the club.
- 18. No center fire rifle, black powder, or shotgun may be used at the club.
- 19. Members and guests must observe all safety rules at all times. Report any observed infractions of club rules to any range officer or member of the Executive Board. Any violations of the club rules will result in disciplinary action and/or expulsion from the club following a meeting of the Executive Board.
- 20. Shooters shall sweep up brass etc., after completion of firing. Keep the range neat and clean.
- 21. Range hours are 0900 to 2300 (9:00am to 11:00pm).
- 22. All guests and family members must fill out and sign a release form. (Only once)

#### **Rules for Junior Members**

- 1. All junior members must fill out the legal form and have it signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- 2. All juniors must be under direct supervision of an adult club member while handling any firearm. Direct supervision means no shooting by the adult member while supervising the junior, except when demonstrating certain methods of handling or cycling the action of firearms.
- 3. Stony Brook Rod & Gun Club Inc. waves any and all responsibilities and liabilities for any injury or damage incurred by any junior if this form (Legal) is not filled out and on file with the club.

### **RANGE QUALIFICATION PROCEDURE**

Note: Members should contact a Range Officer to make arrangements to qualify on the range. The names and phone numbers of the Range Officers are posted on the club bulletin board.

- The Range Officer must review and verify that the shooter understands the essential elements of safe gun handling and range safety.
- The shooter must demonstrate an ability to safely load and unload his/her firearm.
- The shooter must fire a course of 30 rounds "Slow Fire" at an Army-L target at 50'. The shooter must show that they have control of the
  firearm during firing.
- Upon successfully qualifying, the shooter will be issued a qualification card showing the largest caliber they have qualified to shoot.
   Members must display qualification card while assigned to a lane.
