Swimmer Test

Scouts must demonstrate the following: Jump feet-first into water deeper than your head, level off and begin swimming. Swim 75 yards in a strong manner. Swim 25 yards using an easy resting backstroke and afterwards rest by floating for one minute.




BACKPACKING CAMPOUT
