"TAKE A LOOK AT TEACHING" SUMMIT NYSUT'S FIRST 2019

NYSUT's *Take A Look at Teaching* summits held across the state are aimed at cultivating relationships and exploring solutions to the teacher shortage and teacher diversity challenges facing our schools.

The MVFT was invited to attend this year's summit on October 3rd in Yonkers, NY. Superintendent Kenneth Hamilton was invited to attend. "It gave us an opportunity to take a look at what available resources we have to tackle the teacher shortage, and work together on solving the issue in our district," stated Carene Domato.

YFT President Samantha Rosado-Ciriello and NYSUT Executive Vice President Jolene DiBrango hosted the event. DiBrango said the union's initiative is focusing on elevating the profession and encouraging students and career-changers from all backgrounds to take a look at teaching. She noted that NYS teacher preparation programs have declined 53% since 2009. At the same time, the state Teacher's Retirement System projects that one-third of the state's teachers could retire in the next five years. SUNY projects that New York will need 180,000 teachers in the next decade.

President Domato stated, "We need to have a dialogue with teachers, students, higher education faculty and policymakers about how to inspire a new generation to become teachers and help diversify the profession. Summits like these will serve as a vehicle and resource for that dialogue."


A TRIBUTE TO A GREAT LEADER

NY STATE REGENT JUDITH JOHNSON

Judith Johnson, perhaps the best known educator in the Lower Hudson Valley, who fought for educational equity for decades and represented the region on the state Board of Regents since 2015, passed away on October 22. She was 80 years old.

The MVFT leadership enjoyed a special relationship with Judith when she served as interim Superintendent of Mount Vernon City Schools from 2009 to 2012.



She remained a close ally. We were proud when she became NY Regent. She believed in building partnerships and fostered trust and respect. Not only did she maintain her relationship with many of us, she arranged roundtable discussions with all of the locals in our area. She was a staunch advocate for public educators and students. The regents quickly recognized that Judith Johnson was not to be ignored and a force to be reckoned with.

In our last open forum in April 2019, Regent Johnson arranged for all of the Westchester/ Putnam NYSUT leaders to meet with her and two other regents to hear firsthand what issues we had experienced with the state exams. That was the year we had piloted the online ELA and Math grade 3-8 exams that shut down on the first day of testing. The students suffered through untimed exams that lasted beyond the school day. Judith Johnson gave us a voice and we were heard loud and clear at that forum.

The MVFT was honored to know Judith Johnson. She will be dearly missed.

SCHOOL-RELATED PROFESSIONAL'S (SRP) DAY

assistant, who created the bulletin board of Mexican painter, Frida Kahlo.




