The summary financial statement through June is presented above. The church is showing a surplus for the first six months of the year of \$15,405. Hopefully this trend will continue for the second half of the year. Utility costs at the church are running about 19% over budget for the year. We can't control the weather nor the prices currently being charged for energy, but let's try to make sure that we aren't wasting energy during times when the church is not in use. BUDDENBAUM HOUSE

I loved Robert Worden's sermon a couple weeks ago on Hospitality---Spirituality. As I sat there nodding my head like a bobble-head puppy, I couldn't help but think about the church's Buddenbaum project and how perfectly his message applied to this latest First Pres outreach project.

As many of you know, an extensive renovation has been ongoing the past couple years to transform our neglected historic property. First, to stabilize the neglected, deteriorating structure (which has been fully funded) and then to move inside to make the interior 'livable' and ready to provide that abovementioned 'hospitality' and we're very close. Through generous donations from several families, we have accomplished this part debt-free.

Our immediate dream is to turn it into a revenue producer, serving the Paducah hospitality industry as a B&B. But that won't be its full-time job. It will be available to the church for functions, from additional meeting space to added space for weddings to a place of rest for traveling Presbyterian ministers or youth.

The plan is also to become a more visible and integral part of the Lowertown community and of our UNESCO city by showcasing local artists' works, opening our doors to Lowertown house tours and participating with Lowertown arts festivities.

Through our hospitality, we are confident our spirituality as a church will shine.

We are at the point in the process where we'd like to invite anyone who is interested to help us with the final, financial sprint to the end. We still have a checklist of items we need to complete for a final inspection (remember, it's the third oldest residence in Paducah, the oldest in Lowertown and has some issues that need addressing!) We have last minute security measures to take care of, internet/ WIFI connections to make, insurance, and all those smaller things needed to make a lovely B&B happen.

To this end, we would gratefully appreciate any donations. Add your name to the growing number of contributors to the project!

According to Romans 12:13: Hospitality is a valuable spiritual asset for community building. We hope you agree and will help us fulfill this dream.




