Dear Friends,

Advent is upon us! A four-week liturgical period leading up to Christmas, this season is more than a precursor for the holidays. In ancient times, Advent was a period of penitence. Knowing that the arrival of the Messiah required righting of the heart, Christians everywhere acknowledged a need for the Savior. Before celebrations could begin, a period of repentance ensued. Filled with expectation and reverence, Advent was a period of waiting. Still celebrated today, we await Christ's appearance into our world this season, not yet seeing him. Christmas is coming, but not yet.

Our theme for Advent 2022 is *Waiting in Wonder*. Over the next four weeks we will worship together, reflecting on the miraculous gift of Christ's upcoming birth. Each Sunday leading up to Christmas Eve we will light another candle on the Advent Wreath. Full of symbolism, these candles remind us weekly that Christ's presence and light are growing brighter and brighter day by day. As we wait, we give thanks for the wondrous love of God that we will shortly receive. Finally, on Christmas Eve, we will light the Christ Candle in the center of the wreath as we hail the Messiah's arrival once more into the world.

On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, we will celebrate the incarnation and nativity of Jesus Christ. Our period of waiting will be over, and we will rejoice in God's fulfilled promises of love and grace. The season of Christmastide will continue from Dec. 25 until Epiphany on January 6, which many know and sing as the Twelve Days of Christmas. After penitence, we finally proclaim the wonderous gift of Emmanuel – God with us – and begin a new year rejuvenated in Christ.

Join us at First Presbyterian Church for our celebrations. Advent worship services are every Sunday morning at 10:45 a.m. December 18 will be a special day as we gather for our *Festival of Lessons & Carols* in the morning and then enjoy our Children & Youth Christmas Program at 4:30pm. Our Saturday Christmas Eve service will be at 5:30 pm and we will gather once more on Christmas Day for our regular Sunday morning worship.

This season is filled with expectation, anticipation, and hope. May this time of waiting and preparation ready you for Christ's coming. The Prince of Peace is already on his way.

What is Advent? "Advent is a period of spiritual preparation in which many Christians make themselves ready for the coming, or birth of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Celebrating Advent typically involves a season of prayer, fasting, and repentance, followed by anticipation, hope, and joy."

"Advent is a word with Latin roots and means 'coming.' Christians use this period of time before Christmas to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth. It's also a time of repentance and meditation while anticipating Jesus' second coming." (www.learnreligions.com - Mary Fairchild)

These are two of the many definitions found online attempting to describe Advent.

The Fellowship Hall Sunday School Class enters the month of December with the spirit of Advent. We celebrate his first coming where we find him as a babe in a manger. We also look forward to his triumphal return as Lord of Lord and King of Kings.

Our scriptures for the month of December are all found in the Gospel of Luke. Come be a part of our Advent journey. Please take time to grab some coffee and a donut and then join us in the Fellowship Hall Sunday School Class for a festive time during this Holy Season.

Then join us in worship as we follow our traditions. Lighting the Advent candles during worship in the weeks before Christmas is a critical part of preparing our hearts. The four candles focus our attention on the blessings that precede Christ's birth.



LIFELONG LEARNING CLASS

The Lifelong Learning Class will start a new study in December - *Understanding the New Testament*. This is another Great Courses series with lectures by Professor David Brakke from Ohio State University: "The New Testament presents a paradox.

On the one hand, it's a single book, one of two distinct parts of the Christian Bible, and as such, it has provided foundational authority for Christian thought and practice for centuries all over the world. On the other hand, it's 27 different books, reflecting the diverse views of some 16 early Christians who live in different times and places.

That paradox has presented challenges to Christian thinkers from the very moment that the New Testament was born – but it offers wonderful opportunities as well."

- 01/01 New Year's Day no Sunday school class


