Happy New Year!

As we soon pack away the Nativity sets and the last of the Christmas lights (but not until Epiphany, folks!), it is tempting to think of the celebrations of Jesus' birth as being behind us. However, it's quite the opposite. As we begin a new year, we are urged to carry the light of God's hope, peace, joy, and love to guide us on the upcoming journey. Because Christ is with us, we face the days of 2026 with a profound sense of comfort.

This year, our congregational theme is **With Confidence**, rooted in 1 Corinthians 16:13-14:

*"Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. Do everything in love."*

These five commands provide a perfect roadmap for a confident year. To "be on your guard" means protecting our hearts from the distractions and anxieties that so easily pull us away from God's presence. To "stand firm," "be courageous," and "be strong" remind us that our strength doesn't come from our circumstances, but from the solid rock of our salvation. "Do everything in love" reminds us that if we are strong and courageous but lack love, we miss the heart of the Gospel. Love is the ultimate expression of a confident faith – it is the evidence that we believe God guides us in all that we do.

It seems like a tall order, but **With Confidence**, as seen in scripture, isn't a call to self-reliance or pride. It's a call to a deep, unshakable trust in the character of God. As we navigate the challenges and opportunities of this

new year, we ground our hearts with the Lord's fortitude, on which we build our lives.

In the coming weeks, you will see new opportunities to engage with our community and grow in your discipleship. One such day is Sunday, January 11, as we gather for our annual Congregational Meeting. This meeting is more than just a recap from the last year. It is a time to celebrate all that God is doing in our community, and to boldly recommit to partaking in God's work. The meeting will be in the sanctuary immediately following worship.

In 2026, let us, **With Confidence**, step across the threshold of what has been, fixing our eyes on what is yet to come. May we be a people marked by a quiet confidence.

Be on your guard, stand firm, and let love lead the way.

**The Missional Outreach Committee recycles glass. All interested First Presbyterian families are welcome to participate. Former church member Paul Bilak founded this program several years ago by accepting glass to be recycled and periodically hauling it to Carbondale for processing. When Paul moved away, Hutch Smith took over the job.**

**If you want to participate, bring your clean glass in separate cardboard boxes, one for clear glass and one for colored glass and deliver them between now and January 12, 2026 to 323 Hilldale Road. Put your boxes on the table under the carport.**

**After January 12, collect and save your glass at your own house until Hutch issues the next “glass call.” There are usually 3 or 4 trips a year.**
