Siblings in Christ,

A personal reflection as we approach two years of ministry together: *He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "Lord God, you know." (Ezekiel 37:1-6)* I appreciate the prophet Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones in

Ezekiel 37 because I cannot think of a better example of hope. His prophecy pertained to the dispersed tribes of Israel desperate for reunification and how finally, they would be redeemed from exile and brought to new life. We knew the power of God even in physical and metaphorical death, Ezekiel trusted that God's promise of restoration was not only possible, but already on its way.

"Mortal, can these bones live?" God questioned him. "O Lord God, *you* know," Ezekiel affirmed.

Amazingly, there is a resiliency to bone. Bones are the final remnants of our humanity that have seen the worst and upheld us at our best. They grant insight into health, trauma, and lifestyle. Bones tell stories of our past and cast a vision for a different future. The mere presence of bone provides new possibilities for all that can, and may, unfold.

This congregation's spiritual gift throughout the ages, is that we have good bones, and we know it. We realize that our sometimes strewn about yet resilient remains from the past are an opportunity for a grand future. The simple presence of our historic bones reminds us that God can and does grant new life.

It has been two years of ministry together, and fresh sinews develop daily at the church. New members are joining, babies are birthed and baptized, participation and attendance are growing, and the church faithfully cares for those in our community. There is a lively racket as new life swirls within this church. Our steady faith in God has created a refrain of hope. There is laughter and intrigue, vision, and warmth. Like Ezekiel, First Presbyterian Church does not focus on answering whether our bones *can* live, but we fix our eyes to see God's resurrection that is *already* taking place.

"Mortal, can these bones live?" God asks us. "O Lord God, you know," we say.

Miraculously, they do. It is a blessing to serve Christ's church with you. Lex


